~KANAH 1 (29) (Ka'nah) [Reed, Cane]

- A torrent valley that served as a boundary between Ephraim and Manasseh.
- From Tappuah the boundary moved on westward to the torrent valley of Kanah, and its termination proved to be at the sea. This is the inheritance of the tribe of the sons of Ephraim by their families. (Joshua 16:8)
- And the boundary went down to the torrent valley of Kanah, southward to the torrent valley of these cities of Ephraim in the midst of the cities of Manasseh, and the boundary of Manasseh was on the north of the torrent valley, and its termination came to be at the sea. (Joshua 17:9)
- Today it is usually linked with the Wadi Qanah, Nahal Qana. This small stream rises in the hill country a few kilometers Southwest of Nablus and, as the Wadi Ishkar, flows in a southwesterly direction and then joins the Wadi Yarkon, Nahal Yarqon, which empties into the Mediterranean Sea North of Tel Aviv-Yafo.
- However, some scholars believe that in Joshua's day the lower course of the Wadi Qanah perhaps flowed directly into the Mediterranean at a point about 10 kilometers (6 miles) farther North.
