~KENATH (23) (Ke'nath)

- A site East of the Jordan captured by Nobah, probably a Manassite, who thereafter called it by his own name.
- And Nobah marched and went capturing Kenath and its dependent towns, and he began to call it Nobah by his own name. (Numbers 32:42)
- But the designation Nobah perhaps did not stick, for later Kenath is reported to have been taken by Geshur and Syria.
- Later Geshur and Syria took Havvoth-jair from them, with Kenath and its dependent towns, sixty cities. All these were the sons of Machir the father of Gilead. (1 Chronicles 2:23)
- Kenath is identified with the ruins at Kanaouat or Canatha, about 90 kilometers (60 miles) South-Southeast of Damascus and 7 kilometers (4.5 miles) Northwest of modern Soueida. Kanaouat was one of the original ten cities of the Decapolis.
