~LEARNED (212)

[English, studied, was taught, was trained, became skilled at, gained knowledge of, educated, scholarly, academic, cultured, well-read]

- Agur bemoaned that he had not learned wisdom, and the knowledge of the Most High he did not know.
- And I have not learned wisdom, and the knowledge of the Most Holy One I do not know. (Proverbs 30:3)
- Judah likewise came to trust in its alliances with powerful rulers who acted in a beastlike way, like the way of the nations round about them. Like them she began devouring her own sons, even earthling man.
- And he began to walk about in the midst of lions. A maned young lion is what he became. And he gradually learned how to tear apart prey. He devoured even earthling man. (Ezekiel 19:6)
- Then a woman who was known within the city to be a gross sinner, learned that he was at the Pharisees' house, and so she came with an alabaster case of costly perfumed oil.
- And, look! A woman who was known in the city to be a sinner learned that he was reclining at a meal in the house of the Pharisee, and she brought an alabaster case of perfumed oil. (Luke 7:37)
- Then Jesus quoted the scriptures, and showed, that it was written there that: They will all be taught by Yehowah. This comes from (Jeremiah Chapter 31) concerning the New Covenant with God. So then everyone that has heard from the Father, and has learned, comes to Jesus. Jesus then showed, that while this was partly a personal choice, it also was primarily God's personal choice, to select someone to this honor, and then draw them to his son.
- It is written in the Prophets; And they will all be taught by Yehowah. Everyone that has heard from the Father and has learned comes to me. (John 6:45)

- Yet when the Jews in nearby Thessalonica learned that the word of God was also being published by Paul in Beroea, they came there also to incite the people of that city against Paul and Silas.
- But when the Jews from Thessalonica learned that the word of God was published also in Beroea by Paul, they came there also to incite and agitate the masses. (Acts of Apostles 17:13)
- So he told the governor why he had sent Paul to him, because the Jews had seized Paul and were threatening to do away with him. He told Felix that he and his men were forced to rescue Paul, and after questioning him, they learned that Paul was a Roman.
- This man was seized by the Jews and was about to be done away with by them, but I came suddenly with a force of soldiers and rescued him, because I learned he was a Roman. (Acts of Apostles 23:27)
- So after making it safely to shore, they learned that they had landed upon the island of Malta. Now Malta is an island in the Mediterranean lying about 60 miles south of Sicily and having an area of about 95 square miles.
- And when we had made it to safety, then we learned that the island was called Malta. (Acts of Apostles 28:1)
- Paul then finishes his encouragement to all his beloved brothers to watch out for those who break the bond of love among them, by causing divisions, and occasions for stumbling, by teaching things, that go contrary to the Good News, that they have so far learned, and to avoid such men.
- Now I exhort you, brothers, to keep your eye on those who cause divisions and occasions for stumbling contrary to the teaching that you have learned, and avoid them. (Romans 16:17)
- Paul now refers to his own fine example, and tells the Philippians to copy his fine qualities, to stay close to his teachings that they learned from him, and keep doing the things, that they saw him doing when among them. Paul now wants them to make a habit of doing these things, for if they do, then the peace of God will be with them.
- The things that you learned as well as accepted and heard and saw in connection with me, practice these, and the God of peace

will be with you. (Philippians 4:9)

- Paul was not telling them that he was in need, for he was well, but he also wanted them to know, that he learned how to suffer want, and how to be self-sufficient.
- Not that I am speaking with regard to being in want, for I have learned, in whatever circumstances I am, to be self-sufficient. (Philippians 4:11)
- Paul then shows, that he has experienced many different situations in his ministry, and has learned how to have and abundance, and how to be in want, and still manage. Therefore he does not become anxious about what things he needs, for he knows the God will supply his needs.
- I know indeed how to be low on provisions, I know indeed how to have an abundance. In everything and in all circumstances I have learned the secret of both how to be full and how to hunger, both how to have an abundance and how to suffer want. (Philippians 4:12)
- They had evidently learned these things from Epaphras, who was Paul's fellow slave and fellow worker in the Lord. He has gone there to minister to them, in Paul's behalf.
- That is what you have learned from Epaphras our beloved fellow slave, who is a faithful minister of the Christ on our behalf. (Colossians 1:7)
- Paul however encourages Timothy to stay firmly fixed within the things he has already learned, because he knows from what kind of persons, he has learned these things. They are dependable and faithful men.
- You, however, continue in the things that you learned and were persuaded to believe, knowing from what persons you learned them (2 Timothy 3:14)
- Even though Christ was a heavenly Son of God, who had been in direct contact with Yehowah God for eons of time before coming to the earth, and who was supremely submissive to Yehowah God throughout all that time, he learned even further obedience, from the things he

suffered through here on earth, which things were beyond anything, he had ever experienced in heaven.

Although he was a Son, he learned obedience from the things he suffered. (Hebrews 5:8)
