~LEHI (86) (Le'hi) [Jawbone][Hebrew, /a-chai-yah', Greek, si-a-gon']

- The scene of one or, possibly, two Israelite victories over the Philistines. Its exact location is unknown today. Some identify it with Khirbet es-Siyyaj, which perhaps derives its name from the Greek word si-a-gon', jawbone, less than 3 kilometers (2 miles) East of Bethshemesh.
- At Lehi, Samson struck down a thousand Philistines with the moist jawbone of an ass. Subsequently he called the site Ramath-lehi, meaning, Lofty Place of the Jawbone, probably to memorialize the victory Yehowah had given him there.
- Later the Philistines came up and camped in Judah and went tramping about in Lehi. (Judges 15:9)
- Then the men of Judah said; Why have you come up against us? To which they said; It is to tie Samson that we have come up, to do to him just as he has done to us. (Judges 15:10)
- So three thousand men of Judah went down to the cleft of the crag Etam and said to Samson; Do you not know that the Philistines are ruling over us? So what does this mean that you have done to us? Then he said to them; Just as they did to me is the way I have done to them. (Judges 15:11)
- But they said to him; It is to tie you that we have come down, to give you into the hand of the Philistines. At that Samson said to them; Swear to me that you yourselves will not assault me. (Judges 15:12)
- And they went on to say to him; No, but we shall merely tie you, and we will give you into their hand, but we shall by no means put you to death. (Judges 15:13)

Accordingly they bound him with two new ropes and brought him up out of the crag.

He, for his part, came as far as Lehi, and the Philistines, for their part, shouted exultantly at meeting him. And Yehowah's spirit became operative upon him, and the ropes that were upon his

- arms came to be like linen threads that have been scorched with fire, so that his fetters melted off his hands. (Judges 15:14)
- He now found a moist jawbone of a male ass and thrust his hand out and took it and went striking down a thousand men with it. (Judges 15:15)
- Then Samson said; With the jawbone of a male ass, one heap, two heaps! With the jawbone of a male ass I have struck down a thousand men. (Judges 15:16)
- And it came about that when he finished speaking, he immediately threw the jawbone out of his hand and called that place Ramath-lehi. (Judges 15:17)
- Now he became very thirsty, and he began to call on Yehowah and say; It was you that gave this great salvation into the hand of your servant, and now shall I die of thirst and must I fall into the hand of the uncircumcised? (Judges 15:18)
- Originally, though, Lehi may have got its name from the shape of its crags.
- Later, according to the rendering of numerous translators, Shammah struck down many Philistines assembled at Lehi. AT, JB, NW, RS
- And next to him was Shammah the son of Agee the Hararite. And the Philistines proceeded to gather themselves to Lehi, where there then happened to be a tract of the field full of lentils, and the people themselves fled because of the Philistines. (2 Samuel 23:11)
- But he took his stand in the middle of the tract and delivered it and kept striking down the Philistines, so that Yehowah performed a great salvation. (2 Samuel 23:12)

However, the Hebrew term *la-chai-yah'*, literally means, into a tent village, and, by a slight change in vowel pointing, is rendered, to Lehi.
