## ~LOIS (39) (Lo'is)

- Timothy's grandmother and apparently the mother of his mother Eunice. That she was not Timothy's paternal grandmother is indicated by the Syriac rendering, thy mother's mother. Lois is commended by Paul, who indicates that she was a Christian woman having faith without hypocrisy.
- For I recollect the faith which is in you without any hypocrisy, and which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, but which I am confident is also in you. (2 Timothy 1:5)
- The family's residence apparently was in Lystra.
- So he arrived at Derbe and also at Lystra. And, look! A certain disciple was there by the name of Timothy, the son of a believing Jewish woman but of a Greek father. (Acts of Apostles 16:1)
- And he was well reported on by the brothers in Lystra and Iconium. (Acts of Apostles 16:2)
- A comparison of,
- For I recollect the faith which is in you without any hypocrisy, and which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, but which I am confident is also in you. (2 Timothy 1:5)
- And that from infancy you have known the holy writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through the faith in connection with Christ Jesus. (2 Timothy 3:15)
- Suggests that Lois and Eunice both taught Timothy from the Scriptures.
