- When the priest inspected a leper if the looks of the plague had stopped, he must then quarantine him another seven days.
- And the priest must look at him on the seventh day, and if in the way it looks the plague has stopped, the plague has not spread in the skin, the priest must also quarantine him another seven days. (Leviticus 13:5)
- But if the priest looks at it, and, there now, there is no white hair in it and it is not deeper than the skin and it is dull, the priest must then quarantine him seven days. (Leviticus 13:21)
- But if the priest looks at it, and, there now, there is no white hair in the blotch and it is not lower than the skin and it is dull, the priest must then quarantine him seven days. (Leviticus 13:26)
- The mountain peak Peor looks down toward Jeshimon, where Balak and Balaam observed Israel camping.
- With that Balak took Balaam to the top of Peor, which looks toward Jeshimon. (Numbers 23:28)
- There should not be found in a clean people, anyone who looks for omens, like an astrologer or a horoscope reader.
- There should not be found in you anyone who makes his son or his daughter pass through the fire, anyone who employs divination, a practicer of magic or anyone who looks for omens or a sorcerer. (Deuteronomy 18:10)
- The third band would turn to the boundary road that looks toward the valley of Zeboim.
- And the other band would turn to the road of Beth-horon, and the third band would turn to the road to the boundary that looks toward the valley of Zeboim, toward the wilderness. (1 Samuel 13:18)

- David told Abiathar, that anyone who looks for David's soul also looks for Abiathar's soul.
- Just dwell with me. Do not be afraid, for whoever looks for my soul looks for your soul, for you are one needing protection with me. (1 Samuel 22:23)
- Job showed that Yehowah God looks to the very ends of the earth, and all that is there, he sees.
- For he himself looks to the very ends of the earth. Under the whole heavens he sees. (Job 28:24)
- The righteous ones heart is unshakeable, he will not be afraid until he looks upon his adversaries.
- His heart is unshakable, he will not be afraid, until he looks on his adversaries. (Psalms 112:8)
- Jeremiah showed that his own tears for the daughter of Zion would not stop until Yehowah his God looks down from heaven with favor toward his people.
- Until Yehowah looks down and sees from heaven. (Lamentations 3:50)
- When anointed Christians pray they should go into a private place, closing the door to be alone with Yehowah God in secrecy, and in spirit. They Yehowah God who also looks on in secret, will be with them and guide them. One must be desirous of doing the will of God, to gain his blessings.
- You, however, when you pray, go into your private room and, after shutting your door, pray to your Father who is in secret, then your Father who looks on in secret will repay you. (Matthew 6:6)
- However Jesus counseled this man, that no man who looks toward the things behind, is well suited for the Kingdom of God, for it is forward looking, as is faith. Jesus illustrated this by showing how a farmer while plowing a field, must keep his eyes fixed at the far end of the field ahead of him, in order to plow in a straight line. Likewise his followers must keep looking to the things ahead and keep their eyes fixed upon them to gain the Kingdom of God.

- Jesus said to him; No man that has put his hand to a plow and looks at the things behind is well fitted for the kingdom of God. (Luke 9:62)
- When the crowds now started to build, he said to them, that their generation was a wicked generation, which only looks for signs. Yet he assured them, that no sign would be given them, except the sign of Jonah the prophet.
- When the crowds were massing together, he started to say; This generation is a wicked generation, it looks for a sign. But no sign will be given it except the sign of Jonah. (Luke 11:29)
- Such a man takes a quick glance or looks at himself, yet there is no deep examination of himself, and therefore no changes are seen as needed, or desirable. Such a man immediately forgets what kind of a man he is, in relation to what God's word the Bible calls for him to actually be.
- For he looks at himself, and off he goes and immediately forgets what sort of man he is. (James 1:24)
