## ~LOVES (245)

[English, feels affection for, adores, worships, is in love with, is devoted to, cares for, finds irresistible, is keen on, is fond of, Opposite of, hates]

- The Queen of Sheba told Solomon, that Yehowah God loves his people, because he made Solomon king, a wise and righteous judge.
- May Yehowah your God come to be blessed, who has taken delight in you by putting you upon the throne of Israel, because Yehowah loves Israel to time indefinite, so that he appointed you as king to render judicial decision and righteousness. (1 Kings 10:9)
- The Psalmist showed, that the sayings of Yehowah God are very refined, and that the Psalmist loves them.
- Your saying is very much refined, and your own servant loves it. (Psalms 119:140)
- The person whom Yehowah God loves, he reproves through discipline, like a father does with his own children.
- Because the one whom Yehowah loves he reproves, even as a father does a son in whom he finds pleasure. (Proverbs 3:12)
- The way of wicked men is detestable to Yehowah God, but a man pursuing righteousness he loves.
- The way of the wicked one is something detestable to Yehowah, but the one pursuing righteousness he loves. (Proverbs 15:9)
- The lips of righteousness are a pleasure to a grand king, and the speaker of upright things he loves.
- The lips of righteousness are a pleasure to a grand king, and the speaker of upright things he loves. (Proverbs 16:13)
- They will come in and hear all of the words of the Son of Man and they will hear the sound of it like a pretty voice singing a song of sensuous loves, or a skilled musician. They will sit and then listen

attentively but then when the music is over there will be none getting the sense of it in their hearts and doing it.

- And, look! You are to them like a song of sensuous loves, like one with a pretty voice and playing a stringed instrument well. And they will certainly hear your words, but there are none doing them. (Ezekiel 33:32)
- Now the older men of the Jews approached Jesus telling Jesus how this Roman man had assisted them in building their synagogue, and that he loved their nation.
- For he loves our nation and he himself built the synagogue for us. (Luke 7:5)
- Then Jesus told Simon, that her sins, though many, would be forgiven her, for she loved much. Yet the one who is forgiven little, like Simon, who had much less to be forgiven by God, would also love little.
- By virtue of this, I tell you, her sins, many though they are, are forgiven, because she loved much, but he who is forgiven little, loves little. (Luke 7:47)
- John the Baptist then showed, that the father loves his own Son, and thus has given all things into his hands.
- The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand. (John 3:35)
- So Jesus then told his disciples, that this was the very reason that Yehowah God loved him, because he was willing to surrender his very soul, in order, that he might receive it again.
- This is why the Father loves me, because I surrender my soul, in order, that I may receive it again. (John 10:17)
- Then Jesus told them, that the ones who have his commandments, and who observe them, by putting them into practice, they are the ones that love him. Also he told them, that if anyone loves his Christ, then God will also love that one. Jesus then promised to love all such ones, and to come to them, and plainly show himself to them.
- He that has my commandments and observes them, that one is

he who loves me. In turn he that loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and will plainly show myself to him. (John 14:21)

- So Jesus answered, by stating, that if anyone loves Jesus, that then God and Christ would come to them in spirit, and make their abode with them.
- In answer Jesus said to him; If anyone loves me, he will observe my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our abode with him. (John 14:23)
- What is the entire Christian obligation to all others of the human family? To love one another! What things we have promised to others, we should pay to the best of our ability, such as bills, taxes and other dues, for we are all interdependent through society.
- Most men under worldly governments, think that paying such obligations, and obeying the Laws is their only responsibility. However Christians go much further, having an obligation to love their neighbors as themselves. No man who loves another man will kill him. This does not, somehow, fail to apply to persons of another nationality, as the world currently thinks.
- That is why Christians preach the Good News of God's Kingdom to others, and teach and train others to love, and to know God accurately. If men would accept Christian Laws and principles, then these boundaries of peoples, and the hatred that they spawn, would simply disappear. Under God's Kingdom it will disappear.
- Do not you people be owing anybody a single thing, except to love one another, for he that loves his fellowman has fulfilled the Law. (Romans 13:8)
- Yet if a man loves God in his heart, then God knows it about him already.
- But if anyone loves God, this one is known by him. (1 Corinthians 8:3)
- Paul is not trying to change their thinking, and get them to do something, that they do not want to do, or that they cannot afford to do. He wants them to do, just as they have resolved to do in their hearts, from the moment that they first heard of the need to give to

those in Jerusalem. Such giving should never be done grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver, who is like himself.

- Let each one do just as he has resolved in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. (2 Corinthians 9:7)
- Husbands also should be loving their wives, like they love their own bodies, for they are joined together as one flesh through the marriage union. A man who thus loves his own wife, loves himself.
- In this way husbands ought to be loving their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. (Ephesians 5:28)
- Paul now reminds them, that just as our own fathers loved us, and then disciplined us, Yehowah God is the father of our spiritual lives, and he loves us, and therefore he disciplines us. In fact he scourges or severely disciplines, every one that he receives as a son. They all must measure up to his standards for them. They must all do his will.
- For whom Yehowah loves he disciplines, in fact, he scourges every one whom he receives as a son. (Hebrews 12:6)
- John now shows that he who loves his brother stays within the light of God clearly laid out way, and he will find no cause for stumbling out of the truth, for the light of God illuminates his pathway in life.
- He that loves his brother remains in the light, and there is no cause for stumbling in his case. (1 John 2:10)
- John now counsels these anointed Christians, that they should not be loving the world, or the things that the world loves. He warns them that if anyone of them loves the world and its ways, that the love of Yehowah God is not within him, for the two are directly opposed to one another.
- Do not be loving either the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. (1 John 2:15)
- John now shows that we must continue **loving** one another, because **love** is from God. Really, everyone who **loves** has been born

from God, and he gains the knowledge of God, because God is love, and all those who have his spirit know him intimately, and they in turn love others, just as they are being loved by God.

- Beloved ones, let us continue loving one another, because love is from God, and everyone who loves has been born from God and gains the knowledge of God. (1 John 4:7)
- So then, this is the commandment we have from Yehowah God, that the one who says he loves God, must be loving his brother also. To fail to do so, is only to deceive oneself.
- And this commandment we have from him, that the one who loves God should be loving his brother also. (1 John 4:21)
- John then shows that everyone who believes that Jesus Christ came forth from Yehowah God, and who loves Yehowah God themselves, also loves Christ.
- Everyone believing that Jesus is the Christ has been born from God, and everyone who loves the one that caused to be born loves him who has been born from that one. (1 John 5:1)
- Jesus Christ demonstrated that he loves his disciples for he loosed them from their sins by giving his own lifeblood in their behalf.
- And from Jesus Christ, the Faithful Witness, The firstborn from the dead, and The Ruler of the kings of the earth. To him that loves us and that loosed us from our sins by means of his own blood. (Revelation 1:5)
