[English, opulently, richly, luxuriously, splendidly, ornately, handsomely, abundantly, Opposite of, poorly]

- Sampson's hair grew luxuriantly as soon as it had been shaved.
- Meanwhile the hair of his head started to grow luxuriantly as soon as he had been shaved. (Judges 16:22)
- Before his day will it be fulfilled. and his shoot itself will certainly not grow luxuriantly. (Job 15:32)
- Yehowah shows how his feeding of his people, Judah, caused them to become firmly developed with luxuriant hair.
- A very big multitude like the sprouting of the field is what I made you so that you would grow big and become great and come in with the finest ornament. The two breasts themselves were firmly developed, and your own hair grew luxuriantly, when you had been naked and nude. (Ezekiel 16:7)
- Yehowah showed that his people in exile in Babylon would become a **luxuriantly** growing vine turning its foliage inward.
- And it began to sprout and gradually became a luxuriantly growing vine low in height, inclined to turn its foliage inward, and as for its roots, they gradually came to be under it. And it finally became a vine and produced shoots and sent forth branches. (Ezekiel 17:6)
