(Mad-man'nah) [from a root meaning manure]

- And Ziklag and Madmannah and Sansannah. (Joshua 15:31)

- Indicates it to be the same as Beth-marcaboth. Beth-marcaboth, meaning, House of the Chariots, may have been a secondary name of Madmannah.
