[English, exaggerated, overstated, overblown, puffed up, extravagant, Opposite of, understated]

- King Ahasuerus magnified Haman making his throne above all the other princes of his.
- After these things King Ahasuerus magnified Haman the son of Hammedatha the Agagite and proceeded to exalt him and to put his throne above all the other princes that were with him. (Esther 3:1)
- And Haman proceeded to declare to them the glory of his riches and the large number of his sons and everything with which the king had magnified him and how he had exalted him over the princes and the servants of the king. (Esther 5:11)
- Later the same king magnified Mordecai whose exploits are found in the book of the kings of Persia.
- As for all his energetic work and his mightiness and the exact statement of Mordecai's greatness with which the king magnified him, are they not written in the Book of the affairs of the times of the kings of Media and Persia? (Esther 10:2)
- The Psalmist states, that those delighting in Yehowah God's righteousness should cry out joyfully, and magnify Yehowah their God.
- Let those cry out joyfully and rejoice who are delighting in my righteousness, and let them say constantly; Let Yehowah be magnified, who takes delight in the peace of his servant. (Psalms 35:27)
- Let those exult and rejoice in you, all those who are seeking you. Let those say constantly; May Yehowah be magnified, Those who are loving salvation by you. (Psalms 40:16)
- May those exult and rejoice in you, all of whom are seeking you, and may they say constantly; God be magnified! Those loving your salvation. (Psalms 70:4)

- This prophecy about the Messiah Jesus Christ was fulfilled in Judas, who, while eating the bread of the Messiah, his spiritual fare, magnified his heel against him by betraying him for money.
- Also the man at peace with me, in whom I trusted, who was eating my bread, has magnified his heel against me. (Psalms 41:9)
- The Psalmist showed that he would praise Yehowah God for he had magnified his saying even above all his name.
- I shall bow down toward your holy temple, and I shall laud your name, because of your loving-kindness and because of your trueness. For you have magnified your saying even above all your name. (Psalms 138:2)
- Then Yehowah tells the Jews, that their own eyes will see this kind of behavior in them, and they will say; May Yehowah God be magnified over the territory of Israel.
- And your own eyes will see it, and you yourselves will say; May Yehowah be magnified over the territory of Israel. (Malachi 1:5)
- Then her neighbors and relatives heard that Yehowah had magnified his mercy to her, by giving her a son, and they began to rejoice with her.
- And the neighbors and her relatives heard that Yehowah had magnified his mercy to her, and they began to rejoice with her. (Luke 1:58)
- This incident became known to many of both the Jews and the Greeks there in Ephesus, and a very real fear fell upon them all, and through this, the name of the Lord Jesus Christ became magnified among the people there.
- This became known to all, both the Jews and the Greeks that dwelt in Ephesus, and a fear fell upon them all, and the name of the Lord Jesus went on being magnified. (Acts of Apostles 19:17)
- This was in agreement with his eager expectation and hope, that he would not become ashamed in any respect regarding his preaching work, in behalf of the Good News of God's Kingdom. He hoped, that in whatever he did as a Christian, that Christ would always be magnified,

through his work in behalf of the Good News of God, whether through life or death.

In harmony with my eager expectation and hope that I shall not be ashamed in any respect, but that in all freeness of speech Christ will, as always before, so now be magnified by means of my body, whether through life or through death. (Philippians 1:20)
