~MARY 4 (150)

(Ma'ry) [from the Hebrew Miriam, possibly meaning Rebellious]

- The other Mary. She was the wife of Clopas or Alphaeus and the mother of James the Less and Joses.
- Among whom was Mary Magdalene, also Mary the mother of James and Joses, and the mother of the sons of Zebedee. (Matthew 27:56)
- But Mary Magdalene and the other Mary continued there, sitting before the grave. (Matthew 27:61)
- By the torture stake of Jesus, however, there were standing his mother and the sister of his mother, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. (John 19:25)
- Tradition, though without any Scriptural support, says that Clopas and Joseph, the adoptive father of Jesus, were brothers. If true, that would make this Mary Jesus aunt, and her sons his cousins.

- Mary was not only among the women who had accompanied Jesus from Galilee to minister to him but was also one who witnessed his impalement.
- Moreover, many women were there viewing from a distance, who had accompanied Jesus from Galilee to minister to him. (Matthew 27:55)
- There were also women viewing from a distance, among them Mary Magdalene as well as Mary the mother of James the Less and of Joses, and Salome. (Mark 15:40)
- Who used to accompany him and minister to him when he was in Galilee, and many other women who had come up together with him to Jerusalem. (Mark 15:41)
- Together with Mary Magdalene, she lingered outside his tomb that bitter afternoon, Nisan 14.

- But Mary Magdalene and the other Mary continued there, sitting before the grave. (Matthew 27:61)
- On the third day, the two of them and others came to the tomb with spices and perfumed oil for the purpose of rubbing the body of Jesus and, to their alarm, found the tomb open. An angel explained that Christ had risen from the dead, hence he commanded; Go, tell his disciples.
- After the Sabbath, when it was growing light on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to view the grave. (Matthew 28:1)
- And, notice! A great earthquake had taken place, for Yehowah's angel had descended from heaven and approached and rolled away the stone, and was sitting on it. (Matthew 28:2)
- His outward appearance was as lightning, and his clothing as white as snow. (Matthew 28:3)
- Yes, for fear of him the watchmen trembled and became as dead men. (Matthew 28:4)
- But the angel in answer said to the women; Do not you be fearful, for I know you are looking for Jesus who was impaled. (Matthew 28:5)
- He is not here, for he was raised up, as he said. Come, see the place where he was lying. (Matthew 28:6)
- And go quickly and tell his disciples that he was raised up from the dead, and, look! He is going ahead of you into Galilee, there you will see him. Look! I have told you. (Matthew 28:7)
- So when the Sabbath had passed, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices in order to come and grease him. (Mark 16:1)
- And very early on the first day of the week they came to the memorial tomb, when the sun had risen. (Mark 16:2)
- And they were saying one to another; Who will roll the stone away from the door of the memorial tomb for us? (Mark 16:3)

- But when they looked up, they beheld that the stone had been rolled away, although it was very large. (Mark 16:4)
- When they entered into the memorial tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side clothed in a white robe, and they were stunned. (Mark 16:5)
- He said to them; Stop being stunned. You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was impaled. He was raised up, he is not here. See! The place where they laid him. (Mark 16:6)
- But go, tell his disciples and Peter, He is going ahead of you into Galilee, there you will see him, just as he told you. (Mark 16:7)
- On the first day of the week, however, they went very early to the tomb, bearing the spices they had prepared. (Luke 24:1)
- But they found the stone rolled away from the memorial tomb. (Luke 24:2)
- And when they entered they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. (Luke 24:3)
- While they were in perplexity over this, look! Two men in flashing clothing stood by them. (Luke 24:4)
- As the women became frightened and kept their faces turned to the ground, the men said to them; Why are you looking for the living One among the dead? (Luke 24:5)
- He is not here, but has been raised up. Recall how he spoke to you while he was yet in Galilee. (Luke 24:6)
- Saying that the Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be impaled and yet on the third day rise. (Luke 24:7)
- So they called his sayings to mind. (Luke 24:8)
- And they returned from the memorial tomb and reported all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. (Luke 24:9)
- They were the Magdalene Mary, and Joanna, and Mary the mother of James. Also, the rest of the women with them were

telling the apostles these things. (Luke 24:10)

- While they were on their way, the resurrected Jesus appeared to this Mary and the others.
- So, quickly leaving the memorial tomb, with fear and great joy, they ran to report to his disciples. (Matthew 28:8)
- And, look! Jesus met them and said; Good day! They approached and caught him by his feet and did obeisance to him. (Matthew 28:9)
