~MERIB-BAAL (52)

(Mer'ib-ba'al) [possibly, Contender Against Baal, or, Baal Makes a Legal Defense]

- Grandson of King Saul, son of Jonathan, and the father of Micah.
- As for Ner, he became father to Kish. Kish, in turn, became father to Saul. Saul, in turn, became father to Jonathan and Malchi-shua and Abinadab and Eshbaal. (1 Chronicles 8:33)
- And Jonathan's son was Merib-baal. As for Merib-baal, he became father to Micah. (1 Chronicles 8:34)
- This is apparently another name for Mephibosheth. Other persons also had two names, such as Eshbaal, also called Ish-bosheth.
- As for Abner the son of Ner the chief of the army that had belonged to Saul, he took Ish-bosheth, Saul's son, and proceeded to bring him across to Mahanaim. (2 Samuel 2:8)
- As for Ner, he became father to Kish. Kish, in turn, became father to Saul. Saul, in turn, became father to Jonathan and Malchi-shua and Abinadab and Eshbaal. (1 Chronicles 8:33)
- The name Merib-baal is found in two somewhat different Hebrew forms, *Meriv' ba'* and *Meri-va'* al, at;
- And the son of Jonathan was Merib-baal. As for Merib-baal, he became father to Micah. (1 Chronicles 9:40)
- The first form is also used at;
- And Jonathan's son was Merib-baal. As for Merib-baal, he became father to Micah. (1 Chronicles 8:34)
- Indicating similar identity is the fact that Mephibosheth had a boy named Mica and Merib-baal had a son named Micah.
- Now Mephibosheth had a young son whose name was Mica, and all those dwelling in the house of Ziba were servants to Mephibosheth. (2 Samuel 9:12)

- And the son of Jonathan was Merib-baal. As for Merib-baal, he became father to Micah. (1 Chronicles 9:40)
- The forms, Mica and Micah, are due merely to a slight variation in the Hebrew spelling of these names.
