~MESHULLAM 16 (43)

(Me-shul'lam) [from a root meaning, make peace, compensate, repay]

- Son of Berechiah who, under direction of Governor Nehemiah, repaired two sections of Jerusalem's wall.
- And at their side Meremoth the son of Urijah the son of Hakkoz did repair work, and at their side Meshullam the son of Berechiah the son of Meshezabel did repair work, and at their side Zadok the son of Baana did repair work. (Nehemiah 3:4)
- After him Hananiah the son of Shelemiah and Hanun the sixth son of Zalaph repaired another measured section. After him Meshullam the son of Berechiah did repair work in front of his own hall. (Nehemiah 3:30)
- Meshullam also gave his daughter in marriage to Jehohanan the son of Tobiah the Ammonite, a marriage union that caused division among the restored Israelites.
- In those days also the nobles of Judah were making numerous their letters that were going to Tobiah and those of Tobiah that were coming in to them. (Nehemiah 6:17)
- For many in Judah were sworn to him, for a son-in-law he was to Shecaniah the son of Arah, and Jehohanan his son had himself taken the daughter of Meshullam the son of Berechiah. (Nehemiah 6:18)
- Also, good things about him they were continually saying before me. And my own words they were continually taking out to him. There were letters that Tobiah sent to make me afraid. (Nehemiah 6:19)
- Now Tobiah the Ammonite was alongside him, and he went on to say; Even what they are building, if a fox went up against it, he would certainly break down their wall of stones. (Nehemiah 4:3)
