- Yehowah went passing by before his face and declaring; Yehowah, Yehowah, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abundant in loving-kindness and truth. (Exodus 34:6)
- Preserving loving-kindness for thousands, pardoning error and transgression and sin, but by no means will he give exemption from punishment, bringing punishment for the error of fathers upon sons and upon grandsons, upon the third generation and upon the fourth generation. (Exodus 34:7)

(**Jeremiah 26:17**)

- Micah of Moresheth himself happened to be prophesying in the days of Hezekiah the king of Judah and went on to say to all the people of Judah, This is what Yehowah of armies has said; Zion herself will be plowed up as a mere field, and Jerusalem herself will become mere heaps of ruins, and the mountain of the House will be for high places of a forest. (Jeremiah 26:18)
- Did Hezekiah the king of Judah and all those of Judah by any means put him to death? Did he not fear Yehowah and proceed to soften the face of Yehowah, so that Yehowah got to feeling regret for the calamity that he had spoken against them? So we are working up a great calamity against our souls. (Jeremiah 26:19)

- And this one must become peace. As for the Assyrian, when he comes into our land and when he treads upon our dwelling towers, we shall also have to raise up against him seven shepherds, yes, eight dukes of mankind. (Micah 5:5)
- And they will actually shepherd the land of Assyria with the sword, and the land of Nimrod in its entrances. And he will certainly bring about deliverance from the Assyrian, when he comes into our land and when he treads upon our territory. (Micah 5:6)
- And the remaining ones of Jacob must become in the midst of many peoples like dew from Yehowah, like copious showers upon vegetation, that does not hope for man or wait for the sons of earthling man. (Micah 5:7)
- And the remaining ones of Jacob must become among the nations, in the midst of many peoples, like a lion among the beasts of a forest, like a maned young lion among droves of sheep, which, when it actually passes through, certainly both

tramples down and tears in pieces, and there is no deliverer. (Micah 5:8)

- Your hand will be high above your adversaries, and all enemies of yours will be cut off. (Micah 5:9)
- Yehowah will cleanse his people of idolatry and execute vengeance upon disobedient nations.
- And it must occur in that day, is the utterance of Yehowah, that I will cut off your horses from the midst of you and destroy your chariots. (Micah 5:10)
- And I will cut off the cities of your land and tear down all your fortified places. (Micah 5:11)
- And I will cut off sorceries out of your hand, and no practicers of magic will you continue to have. (Micah 5:12)
- And I will cut off your graven images and your pillars from the midst of you, and you will no more bow down to the work of your hands. (Micah 5:13)
- And I will uproot your sacred poles from the midst of you and annihilate your cities. (Micah 5:14)
- And in anger and in rage I will execute vengeance upon the nations that have not obeyed. (Micah 5:15)
- Rely on Yehowah, the rejoicing of the woman enemy will end as Yehowah's repentant people receive his attention and experience wonderful things, filling observing nations with fear. Yehowah will forgive the sins of his people
- But as for me, it is for Yehowah that I shall keep on the lookout. I will show a waiting attitude for the God of my salvation. My God will hear me. (Micah 7:7)
- Do not rejoice over me, O you woman enemy of mine. Although I have fallen, I shall certainly rise up, although I dwell in the darkness, Yehowah will be a light to me. (Micah 7:8)
- The raging of Yehowah I shall bear, for I have sinned against him, until he conducts my legal case and actually executes

- justice for me. He will bring me forth to the light, I shall look upon his righteousness. (Micah 7:9)
- And my enemy will see, and shame will cover her, who was saying to me; Where is he, Yehowah your God? My own eyes will look upon her. Now she will become a place of trampling, like the mire of streets. (Micah 7:10)
- The day for building your stone walls, at that day the decree will be far away. (Micah 7:11)
- At that day even all the way to you they will come from Assyria and the cities of Egypt, and from Egypt even all the way to the River, and from sea to sea, and from mountain to the mountain. (Micah 7:12)
- And the land must become a desolate waste on account of its inhabitants, because of the fruit of their dealings. (Micah 7:13)
- Shepherd your people with your staff, the flock of your inheritance, the one who was residing alone in a forest, in the midst of an orchard. Let them feed on Bashan and Gilead as in the days of a long time ago. (Micah 7:14)
- As in the days of your coming forth from the land of Egypt I shall show him wonderful things. (Micah 7:15)
- Nations will see and become ashamed of all their mightiness. They will put their hand upon their mouth, their very ears will become deaf. (Micah 7:16)
- They will lick up dust like the serpents, like reptiles of the earth they will come in agitation out of their bulwarks. To Yehowah our God they will come quivering, and they will be afraid of you. (Micah 7:17)
- Who is a God like you, one pardoning error and passing over transgression of the remnant of his inheritance? He will certainly not hold onto his anger forever, for he is delighting in loving-kindness. (Micah 7:18)
- He will again show us mercy, he will subject our errors. And you will throw into the depths of the sea all their sins. (Micah 7:19)

You will give the trueness given to Jacob, the loving-kindness given to Abraham, which you swore to our forefathers from the days of long ago. (Micah 7:20)
