[English, stronger, more powerful, more forceful, braver, more able]

- The Egyptians feared Israel because they kept growing mightier through numbers than the Egyptians.
- And the sons of Israel became fruitful and began to swarm, and they kept on multiplying and growing mightier at a very extraordinary rate, so that the land got to be filled with them. (Exodus 1:7)
- And he proceeded to say to his people; Look! The people of the sons of Israel are more numerous and mightier than we are. (Exodus 1:9)
- Yehowah God wanted to strike Israel with pestilence and then to raise up a nation from Moses mightier than they were.
- Let me strike them with pestilence and drive them away, and let me make you a nation greater and mightier than they are. (Numbers 14:12)
- Let me alone that I may annihilate them and wipe out their name from under the heavens, and let me make you a nation mightier and more populous than they are. (Deuteronomy 9:14)
- Balak wanted Balaam to curse Israel for they were mightier as a people than Midian was.
- And now do come, please, do curse this people for me, for they are mightier than I am. Perhaps I may be able to strike them and I may drive them out of the land, for I well know that the one whom you bless is a blessed one and the one whom you curse is cursed. (Numbers 22:6)
- Yehowah God promised to drive away nations mightier than Israel from the Promised Land.
- To drive away nations greater and mightier than you from before you, so as to bring you in, to give you their land as an inheritance as at this day. (Deuteronomy 4:38)

- Hear, O Israel, you are today crossing the Jordan to go in and dispossess nations greater and mightier than you, cities great and fortified to the heavens. (Deuteronomy 9:1)
- David spoke of Saul and Jonathan as being mightier than lions.
- Saul and Jonathan, the lovable ones and the pleasant ones during their life, and in their death they were not separated. Swifter than the eagles they were, mightier than the lions they were. (2 Samuel 1:23)
- The Psalmist showed that his propensity for error was mightier than he was, and asked Yehowah God to cover over his transgressions.
- Things of error have proved mightier than I am. As for our transgressions, you yourself will cover them. (Psalms 65:3)
- Yehowah God kept making his people mightier than their adversaries.
- And he kept making his people very fruitful, and gradually made them mightier than their adversaries. (Psalms 105:24)
- When Yehowah displaces all of the nations, he will demonstrate his own awesome superiority. Like a mighty warrior he will come forth in his zeal, ready to fight. His enemies will only be able to tremble and cringe in fear, they will not be able to stand and fight against him.
- Like a mighty man Yehowah himself will go forth. Like a warrior he will awaken zeal. He will shout, yes, he will let out a war cry, over his enemies he will show himself mightier. (Isaiah 42:13)
