~MILE (45)

- A measure of distance.
- And if someone under authority impresses you into service for a mile, go with him two miles. (Matthew 5:41)
- In the Scriptures *mi'li-on*, the measure in question, is probably the Roman mile (1,479.5 meters) (4,854 feet).
- But, look! On that very day two of them were journeying to a village about seven miles distant from Jerusalem and named Emmaus. (Luke 24:13)
- However, when they had rowed about three or four miles, they beheld Jesus walking upon the sea and getting near the boat, and they became fearful. (John 6:19)
- Now Bethany was near Jerusalem at a distance of about two miles. (John 11:18)
- The word *mi'li-on* does not appear in the Greek text, but the distance figures are given in terms of *stadia* (1 Roman stadium = 1/8 Roman miles)(1 Roman stadium = 1/8 Roman 185 meters). In the New World Translation the figures for the stadia at;
