

~MILE (45)

- A measure of distance.
- And if someone under authority impresses you into service for a **mile**, go with him two miles. (**Matthew 5:41**)
- In the Scriptures *mi'li-on*, the measure in question, is probably the Roman **mile** (1,479.5 meters) (4,854 feet).
- But, look! On that very day two of them were journeying to a village about seven **miles** distant from Jerusalem and named Emmaus. (**Luke 24:13**)
- However, when they had rowed about three or four **miles**, they beheld Jesus walking upon the sea and getting near the boat, and they became fearful. (**John 6:19**)
- Now Bethany was near Jerusalem at a distance of about two **miles**. (**John 11:18**)
- The word *mi'li-on* does not appear in the **Greek** text, but the distance figures are given in terms of *stadia* (1 Roman stadium = 1/8 Roman miles)(1 Roman stadium = 1/8 Roman 185 meters). In the **New World Translation** the figures for the stadia at;- But, look! On that very day two of them were journeying to a village about seven **miles** distant from Jerusalem and named Emmaus. (**Luke 24:13**)
- However, when they had rowed about three or four **miles**, they beheld Jesus walking upon the sea and getting near the boat. and they became fearful. (**John 6:19**)

- Have been converted to statute **miles**. For example, sixty stadia is given as about seven **miles** (11 kilometers).
