- Yehowah described through Ezekiel how his people had mingled with foreigners through marriage against his will.
- For they have accepted some of their daughters for themselves and for their sons, and they, the holy seed, have become mingled with the peoples of the lands, and the hand of the princes and the deputy rulers has proved to be foremost in this unfaithfulness. (Ezra 9:2)
- The Psalmist reflected that in his life he had mingled tears with his eating and drinking which should be a joyous occasion.
- For I have eaten ashes themselves just like bread, and the things I drink I have mingled even with weeping. (Psalms 102:9)
- Yehowah caused a spirit of disconcertedness to mingle in the people of Egypt.
- Yehowah himself has mingled in the midst of her the spirit of disconcertedness, and they have caused Egypt to wander about in all its work, just as someone drunk is made to wander about in his vomit. (Isaiah 19:14)
- During the first trumpet blast there occurs a downpour of hail mingled with fire, much like the one that fell upon ancient Egypt in Moses day.
- And the first one blew his trumpet. And there occurred a hail and fire mingled with blood, and it was hurled to the earth, and a third of the earth was burned up, and a third of the trees was burned up, and all the green vegetation was burned up. (Revelation 8:7)
- Victorious ones are seen beside a glassy sea mingled with fire which represents or symbolizes, the ocean of tears shed by God's anointed sons and the fire the persecution and oppression they have endured.

And I saw what seemed to be a glassy sea mingled with fire, and those who come off victorious from the wild beast and from its image and from the number of its name standing by the glassy sea, having harps of God. (Revelation 15:2)
