~MISLED (192)

[English, gave the wrong impression about, misinformed, deceived, lied to, hoodwinked, deluded, took in]

- Job felt that Yehowah God had misled him, and gone to hunting for his soul, because of all the bad things happening to him.
- Know, then, that God himself has misled me, and his hunting net he has closed in upon me. (Job 19:6)
- The Psalmist called for the presumptuous ones to be ashamed, for without cause they had misled him, while he was trying to carry out the will and counsel of Yehowah God.
- Let the presumptuous ones be ashamed, for without cause they have misled me. As for me, I concern myself with your orders. (Psalms 119:78)
- The prostitute has misled her prey by the abundance of her persuasiveness.
- She has misled him by the abundance of her persuasiveness. By the smoothness of her lips she seduces him. (Proverbs 7:21)
- Jesus then warned his disciples to not be easily misled. There would be many who would come before his presence and his return to them, who would say; I am he! Or who would say; The due time has approached. They should not follow after such ones. His true presence would be as a thief, therefore not one widely announced or publicized.
- He said; Look out that you are not misled, for many will come on the basis of my name, saying; I am he, and, The due time has approached. Do not go after them. (Luke 21:8)
- So the Pharisees, angered that they had failed in their task, answered indignantly; You have not been misled also, have you?
- In turn the Pharisees answered; You have not been misled also, have you? (John 7:47)
- Did these early Christians think, that they could get away with wicked and wrong practices, because they were not under the Law

Covenant, with its penalties for wrongdoing? They were misled if they did, and very much mistaken.

- Paul now makes it quite clear, that fornicators, people who worship idols, adulterers, homosexuals and kept men, were not going to inherit God's Kingdom.
- What! Do you not know that unrighteous persons will not inherit God's kingdom? Do not be misled! Neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men kept for unnatural purposes, nor men who lie with men. (1 Corinthians 6:9)
- Paul now counsels not to associate with those who think this way, that there is no resurrection, and that life is only there for our enjoyment, for their bad association will cause us to have our good spiritual habits corrupted or ruined, and we will be misled. Our aim should be to associate closely with those who share our faith, and who accurately know the truth, and respect it.
- Do not be misled. Bad associations spoil useful habits. (1 Corinthians 15:33)
- Paul now forcefully warns Christians. Do not be misled! God is not one, that any man can mock. Whatever things, that a man is sowing, these are the things he will reap.
- This is a divine principle, and also a truth, and one Paul here illustrated through referencing the work of a farmer, who sows seeds in his field. If he sows wheat, then wheat is what he will reap. If he sows barley, then barley is what he will reap. He can only reap what he sows, and nothing else.
- This principle of equivalence is found throughout the Bible record, and in fact, this verse is the most referenced Scriptural verse in all of the Bible record. What you sow you will reap!
- Do not be misled! God is not one to be mocked. For whatever a man is sowing, this he will also reap. (Galatians 6:7)
- Paul then shows, that during the Last Days, wicked men will then advance from bad to worse, they will mislead others, and they themselves will be misled by others.
- But wicked men and impostors will advance from bad to worse,

misleading and being misled. (2 Timothy 3:13)

- Paul reminds Titus, that even they were once senseless as to the spiritual qualities of their God. At that time they were disobedient to God, being misled by Satan the Devil, due to slaving for many fleshly desires and pleasures. At that time, they were carrying on in badness and envy, towards one another. They were truly abhorrent men, before their God, and they hated one another.
- For even we were once senseless, disobedient, being misled, being slaves to various desires and pleasures, carrying on in badness and envy, abhorrent, hating one another. (Titus 3:3)
- James now makes a powerful statement, for he does not want any of them to be misled, for there are many philosophies within this Satan the Devil's world, and anointed Christians should not be wavering in their faith, for they should know from where all goodness comes forth.
- Do not be misled, my beloved brothers. (James 1:16)
- Now James returns to his earlier argument of helping one another through prayer, showing that one who turns another back from being misled away from the truth, and turns him back to Yehowah God, is doing a fine deed and will surely be repaid by God.
- My brothers, if anyone among you is misled from the truth and another turns him back. (James 5:19)
- They have abandoned the straight path of righteousness and obedience to God, and so they have been misled. Their conduct takes them in a similar path to that of Balaam the son of Beor who loved the rewards offered by wrongdoing, leading to their own early destruction.
- Abandoning the straight path, they have been misled. They have followed the path of Balaam, the son of Beor, who loved the reward of wrongdoing. (2 Peter 2:15)
- Anointed sons are to be put on high to teach and to enlighten others, they should not be put under a measuring basket of scorn and disdain. No more will this lamp ever shine in Jehovah's Witnesses organization again because she has tried to destroy and murder these anointed sons and elevate herself in their place.

- The spiritual lampstand of Jehovah's Witnesses, their national light, has gone out, because they accepted as priests men like Esau who despised spiritual things and let the lamp go out. No voice of a bridegroom, Yahweh, the Son Of Man, or of a bride, his anointed bride class, will ever be heard in you again, for they tried to murder Christ's anointed brothers.
- And no light of a lamp will ever shine in you again, and no voice of a bridegroom and of a bride will ever be heard in you again, because your traveling merchants were the top-ranking men of the earth, for by your spiritistic practice all the nations were misled. (Revelation 18:23)
- The wild beast will be caught in its lies and injustices, and its false prophet image will be shown up for what it really is, just another excuse for men to wickedly rule over one another. Its destruction will clearly mark it as a false prophet, for it said; I sit a queen and I shall never see mourning.
- Both the wild beast, Jehovah's Witnesses, and their claim to be the incoming kingdom of God, will be destroyed suddenly while they are a fully functioning organization, while still alive. They will then go out of existence eternally as an organization. The Lake that burns with fire and sulphur means the second death. They will not return as an organization.
- And the wild beast was caught, and along with it the false prophet that performed in front of it the signs with which he misled those who received the mark of the wild beast and those who render worship to its image. While still alive, they both were hurled into the fiery lake that burns with sulphur. (Revelation 19:20)
