## ~MURMURINGS (72)

[English, speaking softly, talking softly, muttering, whispering, mumbling]

- Moses promised Israel that in the morning they would see the glory of Yehowah God, for he had heard their murmurings.
- And in the morning you will indeed see Yehowah's glory, because he has heard your murmurings against Yehowah. And what are we that you should murmur against us? (Exodus 16:7)
- When the people of Israel murmured against Yehowah God because of their lack of meat to eat, Yehowah God told Moses that he had heard their murmurings.
- And Moses continued; It will be when Yehowah gives you in the evening meat to eat and in the morning bread to satisfaction, because Yehowah has heard your murmurings that you are murmuring against him. And what are we? your murmurings are not against us, but against Yehowah. (Exodus 16:8)
- And Moses went on to say to Aaron; Say to the entire assembly of the sons of Israel, Come near before Yehowah, because he has heard your murmurings. (Exodus 16:9)
- I have heard the murmurings of the sons of Israel. Speak to them, saying; Between the two evenings you will eat meat and in the morning you will be satisfied with bread, and you will certainly know that I am Yehowah your God. (Exodus 16:12)
- How long will this evil assembly have this murmuring that they are carrying on against me? I have heard the murmurings of the sons of Israel that they are murmuring against me. (Numbers 14:27)
- Yehowah heard the murmurings of the Israelites and settled the matter by making the rod of Aaron bud with ripe almonds and flowers showing his selection of Aaron.
- And what must occur is that the man whom I shall choose, his rod will bud, and I shall certainly make subside from against me the murmurings of the sons of Israel, which they are murmuring

## against you. (Numbers 17:5)

- Aaron's rod was placed within the ark of testimony as a witness to the murmurings of the Israelite nation against Yehowah God's authority.
- Subsequently Yehowah said to Moses; Put Aaron's rod back before the Testimony as something to be kept for a sign to the sons of rebelliousness, that their murmurings may cease from against me, that they may not die. (Numbers 17:10)
- Therefore they should do all things free of murmurings against one another, and free from arguments among themselves, for God does not approve of such divisive conduct.
- Keep doing all things free from murmurings and arguments.
  (Philippians 2:14)
