~MURMUR (72)

[English, speak softly, talk softly, mutter, whisper, mumble]

- In the wilderness the people of Israel began to murmur against Moses and Aaron.
- And the people began to murmur against Moses, saying; What are we to drink? (Exodus 15:24)
- And the entire assembly of the sons of Israel began to murmur against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. (Exodus 16:2)
- And in the morning you will indeed see Yehowah's glory, because he has heard your murmurings against Yehowah. And what are we that you should murmur against us? (Exodus 16:7)
- And all the sons of Israel began to murmur against Moses and Aaron, and all the assembly began to say against them; If only we had died in the land of Egypt, or if only we had died in this wilderness! (Numbers 14:2)
- Later when invited by Yehowah God into the Promised Land they murmured at the report returned to them.
- And the men whom Moses sent to spy out the land and who, when they returned, began making the whole assembly murmur against him, by bringing forth a bad report against the land. (Numbers 14:36)
- For that reason you and all your assembly who are gathering together are against Yehowah. As for Aaron, what is he that you men should murmur against him? (Numbers 16:11)
- And directly the next day the whole assembly of the sons of Israel began to murmur against Moses and Aaron, saying; You men, you have put Yehowah's people to death. (Numbers 16:41)
- The assembly of Israel began to murmur against Joshua and the older men for allowing the men of Gibeon to live.
- And the sons of Israel did not strike them, because the chieftains of the assembly had sworn to them by Yehowah the God of

Israel. And all the assembly began to murmur against the chieftains. (Joshua 9:18)

- Thus on receiving their day's pay they began to murmur against the householder, feeling that they had been dealt with unfairly.
- On receiving it they began to murmur against the householder (Matthew 20:11)
- So some of the Jews there began to murmur against him, because he had said, that he was himself the bread of life.
- Therefore the Jews began to murmur at him because he said; I am the bread that came down from heaven. (John 6:41)
