(Na'a-rah) [from a root meaning, shake off]

- . A city on the boundary of Ephraim.
- And the boundary of the sons of Ephraim by their families came to be, yes, the boundary of their inheritance toward the east came to be Ataroth-addar, as far as Upper Beth-horon. (Joshua 16:5)
- And it went down from Janoah to Ataroth and Naarah and reached to Jericho and went out to the Jordan. (Joshua 16:7)
- Thought to be the same as Naaran.
- And their possession and their dwelling places were Bethel and its dependent towns and, to the east, Naaran and, to the west, Gezer and its dependent towns, and Shechem and its dependent towns clear to Gaza and its dependent towns. (1 Chronicles 7:28)
- Naarah is generally considered to correspond to the *No-o-rath'* of Eusebius Onomasticon (136,24). Josephus seemingly calls this site Neara. He relates that half of its waters were diverted to irrigate the palms near Archelaus palace at Jericho. [Jewish Antiquities, XVII, 340, xiii, 1] It has tentatively been identified with Tell el-Jisr, about 3 kilometers (2 miles) Northwest of Jericho.
