

~NAHALAL (38)

(Na-hal'al) [Watering Place, Pasture]

- A city in Zebulun assigned to the Merarite Levites.
- Next the third lot came up for the sons of Zebulun by their families, and the boundary of their inheritance came to be as far as Sarid. (Joshua 19:10)
- And the boundary went around it on the north to Hannathon, and its terminations proved to be at the valley of Iphtah-el. (Joshua 19:14)
- And Kattath and Nahalal and Shimron and Idalah and Bethlehem, twelve cities and their settlements. (Joshua 19:15)
- And the families of the sons of Merari, the Levites who were left over, had out of the tribe of Zebulun Jokneam and its pasture ground, Kartah and its pasture ground. (Joshua 21:34)
- Dimnah and its pasture ground, Nahalal and its pasture ground, four cities. (Joshua 21:35)
- It was also called Nahalol. Instead of driving out the Canaanites inhabiting this city as divinely instructed, the Zebulunites subjected them to forced labor. The site of Nahalal is uncertain.
- Zebulun did not drive out the inhabitants of Kitron and the inhabitants of Nahalol, but the Canaanites continued to dwell in among them and came to be subject to forced labor. (Judges 1:30)
- And for your part, you must not conclude a covenant with the inhabitants of this land. Their altars you should pull down. But you have not listened to my voice. Why have you done this? (Judges 2:2)
