~NAHASH 2 (45) (Na'hash) [Serpent]

- The father of David's sister or half sister Abigail and possibly the father of Zeruiah. He was the grandfather of Abishai, Joab, Asahel, and Amasa.
- And Amasa was the one whom Absalom put in the place of Joab over the army, and Amasa was the son of a man whose name was Ithra the Israelite, who had relations with Abigail the daughter of Nahash, the sister of Zeruiah, Joab's mother. (2 Samuel 17:25)
- And their sisters were Zeruiah and Abigail, and the sons of Zeruiah were Abishai and Joab and Asahel, three. (1 Chronicles 2:16)
- As for Abigail, she gave birth to Amasa, and the father of Amasa was Jether the Ishmaelite. (1 Chronicles 2:17)
- Abigail is called, the daughter of Nahash, but she and her sister are not directly called the daughters of Jesse, David's father, though they are referred to as the sisters of Jesse's sons, including David.
- This leaves several possible relationships. (1) That Nahash was a woman, Jesses wife and the mother of all involved, the name could be given to either sex, but this is not very likely because women were usually introduced into a genealogy only for special reasons, which here seem to be missing. (2) That Nahash was another name for Jesse, as is suggested by early Jewish tradition. The Greek Septuagint [Lagardian edition] has Jesse instead of Nahash in;
- And Amasa was the one whom Absalom put in the place of Joab over the army, and Amasa was the son of a man whose name was Ithra the Israelite, who had relations with Abigail the daughter of Nahash, the sister of Zeruiah, Joab's mother. (2 Samuel 17:25)
- (3) That Nahash was a former husband of Jesses wife, a more likely suggestion, and that she bore Nahash two daughters, Abigail and Zeruiah, before marrying Jesse and bearing him several boys.
