- Seemingly a place where certain prophets resided in the time of Samuel.

- It may refer to a certain locality or quarter of the town of Ramah, in the hill country of Ephraim. Textual critic S. R. Driver corroborates this view, observing: Probably it is the name of some locality in Ramah, the signification of which is lost to us.
