~NEBO 2 (32) (Ne'bo)

- A city, representatives of which returned from Babylonian exile.
- And these were the sons of the jurisdictional district that went up out of the captivity of the exiled people whom Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon had taken into exile at Babylon and who later returned to Jerusalem and Judah, each one to his own city. (Ezra 2:1)
- The sons of Nebo, fifty-two. (Ezra 2:29)
- In the time of Ezra some of the sons, probably, inhabitants, of Nebo dismissed their foreign wives.
- Of the sons of Nebo, Jeiel, Mattithiah, Zabad, Zebina, Jaddai and Joel and Benaiah. (Ezra 10:43)
- These all had accepted foreign wives, and they proceeded to send away wives along with sons. (Ezra 10:44)
- Apparently to distinguish this Nebo from NEBO 1, it is designated as the other Nebo.
- The men of the other Nebo, fifty-two. (Nehemiah 7:33)
- Modern Nuba, located about 11 kilometers (7 miles) Northwest of Hebron, has been presented as a possible identification.
