[English, deprived, disadvantaged, poor, in need]

- A **needy** but wise child is better off than an old and stupid king.
- Better is a **needy** but wise child than an old but stupid king, who has not come to know enough to be warned any longer. (**Ecclesiastes 4:13**)
- Rarely are the **needy** respected for their wisdom for most people feel that if a man lacks material wealth that he is stupid. Therefore they do not value wisdom and fail to be thankful for it.
- And there was found in it a man, **needy** but wise, and that one provided escape for the city by his wisdom. But no man remembered that needy man. (**Ecclesiastes 9:15**)
- And I myself said; Wisdom is better than mightiness, yet the wisdom of the **needy** one is despised, and his words are not listened to. (**Ecclesiastes 9:16**)
- Jesus saw the value of the **needy** making a sacrifice of great value in God's eyes.
- Then he saw a certain **needy** widow drop two small coins of very little value there. (**Luke 21:2**)
