~NETHANEL 1 (50) (Ne-than'el) [God Has Given]

- Chieftain of the tribe of Issachar, son of Zuar.
- Of Issachar, Nethanel the son of Zuar. (Numbers 1:8)
- These are the ones called of the assembly, the chieftains of the tribes of their fathers. They are the heads of the thousands of Israel. (Numbers 1:16)
- In this office, he supervised the wilderness census for Issachar, presented his gift when the tabernacle altar was inaugurated, and led an army of 54,400.
- And those camping alongside him will be the tribe of Issachar, and the chieftain for the sons of Issachar is Nethanel the son of Zuar. (Numbers 2:5)
- And his army and his registered ones are fifty-four thousand four hundred. (Numbers 2:6)
- So Yehowah said to Moses; One chieftain on one day and another chieftain on another day is the way they will present their offering for the inauguration of the altar. (Numbers 7:11)
- On the second day Nethanel the son of Zuar, the chieftain of Issachar, made a presentation. (Numbers 7:18)
- He presented as his offering one silver dish, its weight being a hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels by the shekel of the holy place, both of them full of fine flour moistened with oil for a grain offering. (Numbers 7:19)
- One gold cup of ten shekels, full of incense. (Numbers 7:20)
- One young bull, one ram, one male lamb in its first year, for a burnt offering. (Numbers 7:21)
- One kid of the goats for a sin offering. (Numbers 7:22)
- And for a communion sacrifice two cattle, five rams, five he-

goats, five male lambs each a year old. This was the offering of **Nethanel** the son of Zuar. (Numbers 7:23)

And over the army of the tribe of the sons of Issachar there was **Nethanel** the son of Zuar. (Numbers 10:15)
