~NISROCH (30) (Nis'roch)

- A deity worshiped by Sennacherib the king of Assyria. It was in the temple of Nisroch that Adrammelech and Sharezer murdered their father Sennacherib.
- Therefore Sennacherib the king of Assyria pulled away and went and returned, and he took up dwelling in Nineveh. (2 Kings 19:36)

- A number of scholars suggest identifying Nisroch with the firegod Nusku, who, it was thought, assisted in bringing defeat to the enemy in warfare and served as messenger of the gods as well as a dispenser of justice. However, certain identification of Nisroch with a known Assyrian deity is not now possible
