[English, loud, deafening, earsplitting, piercing, raucous, strident, boisterous, Opposite of, **quiet**]

- True wisdom is at the upper end of the **noisy** streets crying out.
- At the upper end of the **noisy** streets it calls out. At the entrances of the gates into the city it says its own sayings. (**Proverbs 1:21**)
