- I have been afflicted to a great extent. O Yehowah, preserve me alive according to your word. (Psalms 119:107)
- Please take pleasure in the voluntary offerings of my mouth, O Yehowah, and teach me your own judicial decisions. (Psalms 119:108)
- My soul is in my palm constantly, but your Law I have not forgotten. (Psalms 119:109)
- The wicked have set a trap for me, but from your orders I have not wandered. (Psalms 119:110)
- I have taken your reminders as a possession to time indefinite, for they are the exultation of my heart. (Psalms 119:111)
- I have inclined my heart to do your regulations to time indefinite, down to the last. (Psalms 119:112)
