## ~OMER (70) (o'mer)

- A dry measure amounting to one tenth of an ephah.
- This is the word that Yehowah has commanded; Pick up some of it, each one in proportion to his eating. You are to take an omer measure for each individual according to the number of the souls that each of you has in his tent. (Exodus 16:16)
- When they would measure it by the omer, he that had gathered much had no surplus and he that had gathered little had no shortage. They picked it up each one in proportion to his eating. (Exodus 16:18)
- And it came about on the sixth day that they picked up twice as much bread, two omer measures for one person. So all the chieftains of the assembly came and reported it to Moses. (Exodus 16:22)
- Then Moses said; This is the word that Yehowah has commanded, Fill an omer measure of it as something to be kept throughout your generations, in order, that they may see the bread that I made you eat in the wilderness when I was bringing you out of the land of Egypt. (Exodus 16:32)
- So Moses said to Aaron; Take a jar and put in it an omerful of manna and deposit it before Yehowah as something to be kept throughout your generations. (Exodus 16:33)
- Now an omer is a tenth of an ephah measure. (Exodus 16:36)
- The ephah measure is calculated at 22 liters (20 dry quarts) on the basis of archaeological evidence concerning the capacity of the corresponding liquid-measure bath.
- Accurate scales and an accurate ephah and an accurate bath measure you men should come to have. (Ezekiel 45:10)
- As regards the ephah and the bath measure, there should come to be but one fixed amount, for the bath to carry a tenth of a homer and the tenth of the homer an ephah, with reference to

the homer, its required amount should prove to be. (Ezekiel 45:11)

- An omer measure would therefore equal 2.2 liters (2 dry quarts)
- A comparison of the Hebrew text of;
- And a tenth part of an ephah measure of fine flour moistened with the fourth of a hin of beaten oil, and a drink offering of the fourth of a hin of wine, will go for the first young ram. (Exodus 29:40)
- Together with the tenth of an ephah of fine flour as a grain offering moistened with the fourth of a hin of beaten oil. (Numbers 28:5)
- Reveals that a tenth part means a tenth of an ephah, or an omer. This provides a basis for rendering the Hebrew tenth part as tenth of an ephah. AT, NW, Ro, Jp
- The one presenting his offering must also present to Yehowah a grain offering of fine flour, a tenth of an ephah, moistened with a fourth of a hin of oil. (Numbers 15:4)
