[English, arranged, tidy, methodical, neat, logical, systematic, organized, in order, Opposite of, disorderly]

- Paul would then take these men along with him and care for their expenses for this ceremonial cleansing. Then the Jews seeing this would feel, that there was no basis for the rumors, that they had heard, for they would see that Paul was walking orderly, himself keeping the Law.
- Take these men along and cleanse yourself ceremonially with them and take care of their expenses, that they may have their heads shaved. And so everybody will know that there is nothing to the rumors they were told about you, but that you are walking orderly, you yourself also keeping the Law. (Acts of Apostles 21:24)
- Thus Abraham became a father to physically circumcised offspring, through Isaac, and to uncircumcised offspring through Ishmael, who only later received the circumcision through their father's faith. The Jews, the Greater Ishmael, were all circumcised in the flesh, but many failed to adhere to circumcision of the heart, by doing God's will. Those of Israel who made the acceptable sacrifices at the temple, and put faith in them, came to possess, only reputed righteousness from God.
- And a father of circumcised offspring, not only to those who adhere to circumcision, but also to those who walk orderly in the footsteps of that faith while in the uncircumcised state which our father Abraham had. (Romans 4:12)
- Therefore is we are living by spirit, then let us go on walking orderly according to the divine principles of the Law Covenant, which the spirit will help us to successfully manage.
- If we are living by spirit, let us go on walking orderly also by spirit. (Galatians 5:25)
- So to all those who will walk orderly by this rule of conduct, that is, the putting the desires of the fallen flesh to death by our love of God's Holy Spirit, through which we were anointed, upon them be peace and mercy, for they are the Israel of God, Spiritual Israel.

- And all those who will walk orderly by this rule of conduct, upon them be peace and mercy, even upon the Israel of God. (Galatians 6:16)
- Paul also realized, that not all in the Christian congregation, have made the same degree of spiritual progress, but still he counsels them all, to go on walking orderly in this same routine.
- At any rate, to what extent we have made progress, let us go on walking orderly in this same routine. (Philippians 3:16)
- Paul now shows what kind of a man the overseer must be, within the true anointed congregation of God. Such a man should be irreprehensible, meaning blameless, flawless or faultless, complete or perfect.
- He should be a husband of one wife, if he is married, and should have moderate personal habits. He should have a sound mind, and be orderly or well organized.
- Since he is one taking the lead in bringing together new ones, and the entire congregation for study and teaching, he must be hospitable to others, and also be qualified to teach the truth, like a skilled workman, handling the word of truth aright.
- The overseer should therefore be irreprehensible, a husband of one wife, moderate in habits, sound in mind, orderly, hospitable, qualified to teach. (1 Timothy 3:2)
