## ~OVERSIGHT (81)

[English, mistake, failure to notice, ommission, slip, misunderstanding, error, lapse]

- Aaron's son Eleazar had oversight of those taking care of the obligation of the holy place.
- And the chieftain of the chieftains of the Levites was Eleazar the son of Aaron the priest, who had the oversight of those taking care of the obligation to the holy place. (Numbers 3:32)
- The sons of Merari had oversight of the panel frames, its bars and pillars.
- And the oversight for which the sons of Merari were obligated was over the panel frames of the tabernacle and its bars and its pillars and its socket pedestals and all its utensils and all its service. (Numbers 3:36)
- Eleazar had oversight of the oil for the luminary, the perfumed incense, the constant grain offering and the anointing oil.
- And the oversight of Eleazar the son of Aaron the priest is over the oil of the luminary and the perfumed incense and the constant grain offering and the anointing oil, the oversight of all the tabernacle and all that is in it, namely, the holy place and its utensils. (Numbers 4:16)
- The Psalmist prophesied that the one betraying the Messiah would lose his office of oversight, and that someone else would take it.
- Let his days prove to be few, his office of oversight let someone else take. (Psalms 109:8)
- But as usual Jeremiah's actions were misconstrued by the officer having oversight of the gate. He accused Jeremiah of falling away to the Babylonians. This was not the case, but Jeremiah was just strengthening his position, and his ability to survive the coming onslaught.
- So it came about when he was in the Gate of Benjamin that the officer holding the oversight, whose name was Irijah the son of

Shelemiah the son of Hananiah, was there. At once he took hold of Jeremiah the prophet, saying; It is to the Chaldeans that you are falling away! (Jeremiah 37:13)

- Since they decided to cling to men, their dungy idols, rather than cling to Yehowah he has now placed them in positions where they will now minister to the people and not be close to him. They will do the hard manual work of slaughtering the whole burnt offerings and the communion offerings of the people.
- And in my sanctuary they must become ministers at posts of oversight over the gates of the House and ministers at the House. They themselves will slaughter the whole burnt offering and the sacrifice for the people, and they themselves will stand before them to minister to them. (Ezekiel 44:11)
- Peter then showed from the Psalms, that it was written, that his dwelling place, the field he purchased, would become desolate. Also it showed in this Psalm, that his oversight as an apostle of Christ, someone else would take, for there must be twelve apostles.
- For it is written in the book of Psalms, Let his lodging place become desolate, and let there be no dweller in it, and, His office of oversight let someone else take. (Acts of Apostles 1:20)
