~OVERTAKE (206)

[English, pass, go beyond, go past, overhaul, leave behind, outdo, surpass, Opposite of, fall behind]

- Joseph told his house servant to chase after his brothers and overtake them, asking them why they had repaid bad for good.
- They went out of the city. They had not gone far when Joseph said to the man who was over his house; Get up! Chase after the men and be certain to overtake them and to say to them, Why have you repaid bad for good? (Genesis 44:4)
- In Moses' victory song he mentioned that their enemy Pharaoh had planned to overtake Israel, but Yehowah God had brought forth for them a crushing defeat.
- The enemy said; I shall pursue! I shall overtake! I shall divide spoil! My soul will be filled with them! I shall draw my sword! My hand will drive them away! (Exodus 15:9)
- Cities of refuge were established for Israelites accidentally killing a man, so that the avenger of blood might not overtake them before justice could be firmly established.
- Otherwise, the avenger of blood may, because his heart is hot, chase after the manslayer and actually overtake him, since the way is great, and he may indeed strike his soul fatally, whereas there is no sentence of death for him, because he was no hater of him formerly. (Deuteronomy 19:6)
- Moses showed that many maledictions would overtake Israel if they failed to listen and to obey their God.
- And all these blessings must come upon you and overtake you, because you keep listening to the voice of Yehowah your God. (Deuteronomy 28:2)
- And it must occur that if you will not listen to the voice of Yehowah your God by taking care to do all his commandments and his statutes that I am commanding you today, all these maledictions must also come upon you and overtake you. (Deuteronomy 28:15)

- And all these maledictions will certainly come upon you and pursue you and overtake you until you have been annihilated, because you did not listen to the voice of Yehowah your God by keeping his commandments and his statutes that he commanded you. (Deuteronomy 28:45)
- Rahab told the men of her city that the spies left through the gate at dusk, and that they should chase after them and overtake them.
- And it came about at the closing of the gate by dark that the men went out. I just do not know where the men have gone. Chase after them quickly, for you will overtake them. (Joshua 2:5)
- David inquired after Yehowah God as to whether he should overtake a maurauder band and war against them.
- And David began to inquire of Yehowah, saying; Shall I chase after this marauder band? Shall I overtake them? At this he said to him; Go in chase, for you will without fail overtake them, and you will without fail make a deliverance. (1 Samuel 30:8)
- A military force of the Chaldeans went to chasing after Zedekiah by night, and they got to overtake him near to Jericho.
- And a military force of Chaldeans went chasing after the king, and they got to overtake him in the desert plains of Jericho, and all his own military force was scattered from his side. (2 Kings 25:5)
- Yehowah God let David choose his poison, as to what would overtake him for his punishment.
- Whether for three years there is to be a famine, or for three months there is to be a sweeping away from before your adversaries and for the sword of your enemies to overtake you, or for three days there is to be the sword of Yehowah, even pestilence, in the land, with Yehowah's angel bringing ruin in all the territory of Israel. And now see what I should reply to the One sending me. (1 Chronicles 21:12)
- Job shows that sudden terror will overtake the apostate, like a stormwind in the night.

- Like waters sudden terrors will overtake him, at night a storm wind will certainly steal him away. (Job 27:20)
- The Psalmist showed, that if he had repaid bad for good, then Yehowah God should let his enemy pursue him and overtake him.
- Let an enemy pursue my soul and let him overtake and trample my life down to the very earth and cause my own glory to reside in the dust itself. (Psalms 7:5)
- Yehowah God promises to pursue his enemies and to overtake them until they are exterminated.
- I shall pursue my enemies and overtake them, and I shall not return until they are exterminated. (Psalms 18:37)
- The Psalmist asks for the burning anger of Yehowah God to overtake his enemies.
- Pour out upon them your denunciation, and may your own burning anger overtake them. (Psalms 69:24)
- The Babylonian forces then chased after Zedekiah and all his men deserted him, and they captured him alive. They got as far as Jericho where they were overtaken and captured, and then were brought to Riblah in the land of Hamath.
- And a military force of the Chaldeans went chasing after them, and they got to overtake Zedekiah in the desert plains of Jericho. Then they took him and brought him up to Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon at Riblah in the land of Hamath that he might pronounce upon him judicial decisions. (Jeremiah 39:5)
- The Chaldeans soon learned, that the King and his men had fled, and they went chasing after them, and overtook them near to Jericho. Then all of his military force scattered, and the King Zedekiah was captured, and taken to Riblah to Nebuchadnezzar.
- And a military force of the Chaldeans went chasing after the king, and they got to overtake Zedekiah in the desert plains of Jericho, and all his own military force was scattered from his side.

 (Jeremiah 52:8)

- Yehowah through Hosea now shows, that once she becomes thoroughly lost in this world, she will chase after her passionate lovers, but will no longer be able to find any, because she has walked away from her true calling to godly conduct. Later though, she will say that she will return to her husband, for she had it better when under him, than she now has it.
- And she will actually chase after her passionate lovers, but she will not overtake them, and she will certainly look for them, but she will not find them. And she will have to say; I want to go and return to my husband, the first one, for I had it better at that time than now. (Hosea 2:7)
- Then from the days of Gibeah they have sinned, from their very beginnings. That was against the sons of Benjamin for their unrighteousness did not overtake so as to completely destroy them, for a seed was left to them.
- From the days of Gibeah you have sinned, O Israel. There they stood still. In Gibeah war against the sons of unrighteousness did not get to overtake them. (Hosea 10:9)
- In that day Yehowah God promises to provide to his people an abundance of both material and spiritual blessings, so that the plowman sowing the seed will actually overtake the harvester who is still harvesting last year's crop. Likewise the treader of grapes will overtake the carrier of the seed for the new crop. Then the governments of the earth will have plenty, and the lesser governments, hills, will find themselves not even needed, and they will melt away.
- Look! There are days coming, is the utterance of Yehowah, and the plowman will actually overtake the harvester, and the treader of grapes, the carrier of the seed, and the mountains must drip with sweet wine, and the very hills will all find themselves melting. (Amos 9:13)
- Anointed Christians who have the Holy Spirit in their lives, are not in darkness, so that this day day of Yehowah should overtake them, as if a thief had come forth upon them. They must pay attention to the spirit, and to the many signs, of the presence of the day of Yehowah and its nearness to see it.
- But you, brothers, you are not in darkness, so that that day should overtake you as it would thieves. (1 Thessalonians 5:4)
