~PATMOS (29) (Pat'mos)

- An island where the apostle John was exiled for speaking about God and bearing witness to Jesus.
- I John, your brother and a sharer with you in the tribulation and kingdom and endurance in company with Jesus, came to be in the isle that is called Patmos for speaking about God and bearing witness to Jesus. (Revelation 1:9)
- While there, he received the Revelation. According to ancient tradition, John, having been condemned by Domitian to dwell on the island of Patmos, was released after the death of that ruler, 96 C.E. [The Ante-Nicene Fathers, Vol. VIII, p. 562, Acts of the Holy Apostle and Evangelist John the Theologian.]
- Situated in the Icarian Sea, a part of the Aegean, about 55 kilometers (34 miles) West of Asia Minor, Patmos lay about 60 kilometers (37 miles) West-Southwest of Miletus and less than 240 kilometers (150 miles) from all seven congregations specifically addressed in (Revelation Chapters 2-3). This small volcanic island has a very irregular coastline and is quite barren and rocky.
- But today wheat, olives, and grapes are cultivated there.
 Apparently because of its isolation, Patmos, along with other Aegean islands, served as a penal isle.
