~PENUEL 3 (57) (Pe-nu'el) [Face of God]

- A city to the South of the Jabbok. In the time of the Judges, Gideon asked the men of Penuel for food in order, that his forces might continue to pursue the kings of Midian, but the Penuelites refused, for which reason Gideon later destroyed their tower and killed all their men.
- Eventually Gideon came to the Jordan, crossing it, he and the three hundred men that were with him, tired but keeping up the pursuit. (Judges 8:4)
- Later he said to the men of Succoth; Please give round loaves of bread to the people that are following my steps, for they are tired and I am chasing after Zebah and Zalmunna, the kings of Midian. (Judges 8:5)
- But the princes of Succoth said; Are the palms of Zebah and of Zalmunna already in your hand so that bread has to be given to your army? (Judges 8:6)
- At this Gideon said; That is why when Yehowah gives Zebah and Zalmunna into my hand, I shall certainly give your flesh a threshing with the thorns of the wilderness and the briers. (Judges 8:7)
- And he continued on his way up from there to Penuel and went speaking to them in this same manner, but the men of Penuel answered him just as the men of Succoth had answered. (Judges 8:8)
- Hence he said also to the men of **Penuel**; When I return in peace, I shall pull down this tower. (Judges 8:9)
- And the tower of Penuel he pulled down, and he proceeded to kill the men of the city. (Judges 8:17)
- Nothing more is mentioned of **Penuel** until King Jeroboam I built it again, or at least fortified it.
- And Jeroboam proceeded to build Shechem in the mountainous

region of Ephraim and to dwell in it. Then he went forth from there and built Penuel. (1 Kings 12:25)

- Penuel is generally identified with Tulul edh-Dhahab esh-Sherqiyeh, about 6 kilometers (3.5 miles) East of Succoth and near the Jabbok, some 14 kilometers (8.5 miles) or so Northeast of its confluence with the Jordan.
- Indications are that it was heavily fortified and strategically positioned so as to control the entrance of the Jabbok gorge leading westward down to the Jordan.
