- **Nebuchadnezzar**, knew that anyone could fake an interpretation, if his life was threatened, but only a wise man would go to God for assistance. Rather than accept lies from men who were just trying to preserve their own existence, he looked for a man who could know both the dream and its correct interpretation.
- The king was answering and saying; For a fact, I am aware that time is what you men are trying to gain, forasmuch as you have **perceived** that the word is being promulgated by me. (**Daniel 2:8**)
- Then his disciples **perceived** that he was speaking about John the Baptist, whom some of them had earlier followed before following Jesus Christ.
- Then the disciples **perceived** that he spoke to them about John the Baptist. (**Matthew 17:13**)
- Then when he left the sanctuary he was unable to speak, and they **perceived** that he had seen some kind of supernatural sight while within the sanctuary. Thus he kept making signs to them to try to explain what happened, but he remained dumb, unable to say anything.
- But when he came out he was not able to speak to them, and they **perceived** that he had just seen a supernatural sight in the sanctuary, and he kept making signs to them, but remained dumb. (**Luke 1:22**)
- So Jesus told Peter, that he knew that someone touched him in faith, for he **perceived** the power of the Holy Spirit flowing through him.
- Yet Jesus said; Someone touched me, for I **perceived** that power went out of me. (**Luke 8:46**)
- Now the scribes and the chief priests recognized, that he spoke this concerning them, and so they took counsel that very hour to get their hands on him, and destroy him. Yet they had to be careful,

because they feared what the people might do if they seized him openly. Then **perceived** that his illustrations were given, with them in mind.

- The scribes and the chief priests now sought to get their hands on him in that very hour, but they feared the people, for they **perceived** that he spoke this illustration with them in mind. (Luke 20:19)
- Now the men hearing this fine witness, **perceived** about Peter and John, that they were not men who had attended the schools, but men who were considered by them, to be unlettered and ordinary, and so they got to wondering, how Peter and John came to understand such detailed matters of the scriptures. Then they began to recognize, that these men had been with Jesus throughout his ministry.
- Now when they beheld the outspokenness of Peter and John, and **perceived** that they were men unlettered and ordinary, they got to wondering. And they began to recognize about them that they used to be with Jesus. (Acts of Apostles 4:13)
- So Festus then declared, that after examining Paul, he found no basis for any of the serious charges leveled against him by the Jews. Then Paul himself had appealed to Caesar, and so, he Festus had decided to send Paul off to Caesar for judgment.
- But I **perceived** he had committed nothing deserving of death. So when this man himself appealed to the August One, I decided to send him. (Acts of Apostles 25:25)
- Yes, the things that God has made, which simply fill our earth, testify about his greatness and his marvelous qualities. It is inexcusable for men who have the power to think and reason, not to realize consciously, what God is like. Have you as an individual, thought about these things deeply. Anyone failing to do so, will not be forgiven for it by God.
- For his invisible qualities are clearly seen from the world's creation onward, because they are **perceived** by the things made, even his eternal power and godship, so that they are inexcusable. (Romans 1:20)
