

~PERFORMING (160)

[English, drama, the theatre, the performing arts, the stage, presentation, recital, acting, routine, concert, show, piece]

- Esther was **performing** the saying of Mordecai to keep her ancestry a secret from others there in the court of the king of Persia.
- Esther was not telling about her relatives and her people, just as Mordecai had laid the command upon her, and the saying of Mordecai Esther was **performing**, just as when she happened to be under care by him. (**Esther 2:20**)
- Haman told the king that the Jews as a people were not performing the king's laws as all other people did.
- And Haman proceeded to say to King Ahasuerus; There is one certain people scattered and separated among the peoples in all the jurisdictional districts of your realm, and their laws are different from all other peoples, and the kings own laws they are not **performing**, and for the king it is not appropriate to let them alone. (**Esther 3:8**)
- The Psalmist showed that Yehowah God was his king, the one **performing** grand salvation in the midst of the earth.
- And yet God is my King from long ago, the One **performing** grand salvation in the midst of the earth. (**Psalms 74:12**)
- Darius then realized that Yehowah God is the God **performing** signs and wonders in heaven and on earth, for he had rescued Daniel from the lion's den.
- He is rescuing and delivering and **performing** signs and wonders in the heavens and on the earth, for he has rescued Daniel from the paw of the lions. (**Daniel 6:27**)
- Part of the Law Covenant, was that a man must keep his word, and that anything to which he swore to, was a vow that he must pay. There was no release from this keeping of vows of any kind.
- Again you heard that it was said to those of ancient times; You must not swear without **performing**, but you must pay your vows

to Yehowah. (**Matthew 5:33**)

- So they left and began to go throughout the territory of Israel from village to village while declaring the Good News of God's Kingdom everywhere. Also they were performing cures among the people, and expelling demons wherever they went.
- Then starting out they went through the territory from village to village, declaring the Good News and **performing** cures everywhere. (**Luke 9:6**)
- So while Jesus was at this Passover, there were many people there for the celebration, who then put their faith in him, after viewing the signs that he was **performing**.
- However, when he was in Jerusalem at the Passover, at its festival, many people put their faith in his name, viewing his signs that he was **performing**. (**John 2:23**)
- Yet a great crowd kept following him, for they were beholding and marveling over the signs he was **performing** for the sickly ones among them.
- But a great crowd kept following him, because they were beholding the signs he was **performing** upon those who were ill. (**John 6:2**)
- So then they asked him what he was doing, what he was **performing** as a sign, so that they might see it, and believe in him. They asked him; What work are you doing?
- Therefore they said to him; What, then, are you **performing** as a sign, in order for us to see it and believe you? What work are you doing? (**John 6:30**)
- Now one of these seven men, Stephen, was full of graciousness and power through the Holy Spirit, and he was **performing** great signs and portents among the people of Israel, there in Jerusalem.
- Now Stephen, full of graciousness and power, was **performing** great portents and signs among the people. (**Acts of Apostles 6:8**)

- There the people of Samaria were paying close attention to the preaching of Phillip, and were convinced by the powerful signs he **performed** before them.
- With one accord the crowds were paying attention to the things said by Philip while they listened and looked at the signs he was **performing**. (**Acts of Apostles 8:6**)
- Throughout this time Paul kept **performing** extraordinary works of power through the Holy Spirit from Yehowah God.
- And God kept **performing** extraordinary works of power through the hands of Paul. (**Acts of Apostles 19:11**)
- Paul now turns their attention to another principle of the Law Covenant, the Aaronic priesthood. Yehowah's Law set out for them to be able to satisfy their material needs while doing temple service, by giving to them all of the offerings offered at the temple, except for whole burnt offerings, which were consumed. Thus those who worked at the temple, were cared for under God's loving provisions for them.
- Do you not know that the men **performing** sacred duties eat the things of the temple, and those constantly attending at the altar have a portion for themselves with the altar? (**1 Corinthians 9:13**)
- He counseled them, that if Timothy arrived with them to give him a warm welcome, and make him feel at home with them as friends, just as Paul was to them. Timothy, like Paul was **performing** the same work of Yehowah, as was Paul, and so he should be warmly welcomed by all there in Corinth.
- However, if Timothy arrives, see that he becomes free of fear among you, for he is **performing** the work of Yehowah, even as I am. (**1 Corinthians 16:10**)
- Paul extends his wish for this wonderful God to equip them for every good work for the accomplishing of his will among them. Thus through the power of the Holy Spirit exercised among them through Jesus Christ, they may be doing, that which is well-pleasing in the sight of God. He is the one alone to whom honor and glory are to be given to time indefinite.
- Equip you with every good thing to do his will, **performing** in us

through Jesus Christ that which is well-pleasing in his sight, to whom be the glory forever and ever. Amen. ([Hebrews 13:21](#))
