- So the unclean spirits obeyed Jesus' voice, and they immediately left the man, and they went and entered into the herd of swine. Then the entire herd of swine, numbering around two thousand animals, rushed over the precipice and killed themselves by drowning themselves in the sea below. They were not liking what the unclean spirits made them feel like either.
- And he permitted them. With that the unclean spirits came out and entered into the swine, and the herd rushed over the precipice into the sea, about two thousand of them, and they drowned one after another in the sea. (Mark 5:13)
- Paul then witnessed, that in the past, Yehowah God had permitted the nations outside of the Israelite nation, to go on in their own way, and to worship as they pleased.
- In the past generations he permitted all the nations to go on in their ways. (Acts of Apostles 14:16)
- So the next day the contingent of soldiers left to return to Jerusalem, and the seventy horsemen took Paul the remaining distance to Caesarea, they, having now escaped the immediate danger.
- The next day they permitted the horsemen to go on with him, and they returned to the soldiers quarters. (Acts of Apostles 23:32)
- So now the floor was given to Paul, and he was told that he was now permitted to speak in his own defense.
- Agrippa said to Paul; You are permitted to speak in behalf of yourself. Then Paul stretched his hand out and proceeded to say in his defense. (Acts of Apostles 26:1)
- So the next day they landed at Sidon, and the army officer Julius treated Paul with extraordinary human kindness, by permitting Paul to go with his friends and enjoy their company and care. Paul had now been under bonds for over two years, and he had done nothing wrong.

- And the next day we landed at Sidon, and Julius treated Paul with human kindness and permitted him to go to his friends and enjoy their care. (Acts of Apostles 27:3)
- So when Paul's party arrived in Rome, Paul was permitted to stay by himself, with a soldier guarding him, in a rented house.
- When, finally, we entered into Rome, Paul was permitted to stay by himself with the soldier guarding him. (Acts of Apostles 28:16)
- Women are to keep silent in the congregation of God, for it is not permitted of them to speak publicly in a congregation. It is the role of the men to carry on these discussions, and the women may question their husbands at home, about any matter they are having trouble understanding.
- Let the women keep silent in the congregations, for it is not permitted for them to speak, but let them be in subjection, even as the Law says. (1 Corinthians 14:34)
