## ~PHILIP 3 (35)

(Phil'ip) [meaning, Fond of Horses, Horse-Loving]

- Husband of Herodias and father of Salome. He was living in Rome at the time his wife adulterously left him to become the wife of his half brother Herod Antipas.
- For Herod had arrested John and bound him and put him away in prison on account of Herodias the wife of Philip his brother. (Matthew 14:3)
- For John had been saying to him; It is not lawful for you to be having her. (Matthew 14:4)
- For Herod himself had sent out and arrested John and bound him in prison on account of Herodias the wife of Philip his brother, because he had married her. (Mark 6:17)
- For John had repeatedly said to Herod; It is not lawful for you to be having the wife of your brother. (Mark 6:18)
- But Herod the district ruler, for being reproved by him concerning Herodias the wife of his brother and concerning all the wicked deeds that Herod did. (Luke 3:19)
- Added also this to all those deeds, he locked John up in prison. (Luke 3:20)
- Philip was a son of Herod the Great by his third wife, Mariamne II the daughter of the High Priest Simon. He was, therefore, half Jew and half Idumean.
