## ~PIERCE (40)

[English, stab, cut, slice, slice open, penetrate, prick, perforate, puncture]

- A slave who wished to remain with his master after his tenure ended would ask to have his ear pierced with an awl at the doorpost of the masters house and then he ld remain his slave forever.
- Then his master must bring him near to the true God and must bring him up against the door or the doorpost, and his master must pierce his ear through with an awl, and he must be his slave to time indefinite. (Exodus 21:6)
- Yehowah described Egypt as a crushed reed which is a man should lean upon it it would splinter and pierce him.
