~PIM (21)

- The price that the Philistines charged the Israelites for sharpening various metal implements.
- And all the Israelites would go down to the Philistines to get each one his plowshare or his mattock or his ax or his sickle sharpened. (1 Samuel 13:20)
- And the price for sharpening proved to be a pim for the plowshares and for the mattocks and for the three-toothed instruments and for the axes and for fixing fast the oxgoad. (1 Samuel 13:21)
- The pim apparently was a weight. Several stone weights found in Palestinian excavations bear the consonants of pim in ancient Hebrew characters, these vary from 7.18 to 8.13 grams (0.231 to 0.261 ounces troy). On this basis the pim would be approximately two thirds of a shekel.
