(Pir'a-thon)[Pirathonite, Pir'a-thon-ite, Of, or belonging to, Pirathon]

- Pirathon was a town of Ephraim in the mountain of the Amalekite. Evidently an inhabitant of Pirathon was known as a Pirathonite, as were Hillel and, later, Benaiah, one of David's mighty men. Hillels son Judge Abdon was buried there.
- And after him Abdon the son of Hillel the Pirathonite began to judge Israel. (Judges 12:13)
- Then Abdon the son of Hillel the Pirathonite died and was buried in Pirathon in the land of Ephraim in the mountain of the Amalekite. (Judges 12:15)
- These are the names of the mighty men that belonged to David; Josheb-basshebeth a Tahchemonite, the head of the three. He was brandishing his spear over eight hundred slain at one time. (2 Samuel 23:8)
- Benaiah a Pirathonite, Hiddai of the torrent valleys of Gaash. (2 Samuel 23:30)
- Ithai the son of Ribai of Gibeah of the sons of Benjamin, Benaiah the Pirathonite. (1 Chronicles 11:31)
- The eleventh for the eleventh month was Benaiah the Pirathonite of the sons of Ephraim, and in his division there were twenty-four thousand. (1 Chronicles 27:14)
- Far`ata, about 10 kilometers (6 miles) West of the suggested location for Shechem, has been suggested as a possible identification.
