## ~PLENTY (140)

[English, abundance, copiousness, bounty, profusion, prosperity, plethora, Opposite of, insufficiency]

- Joseph foretold seven years of coming plenty for the land of Egypt.
- Here there are seven years coming with great plenty in all the land of Egypt. (Genesis 41:29)
- He also foretold seven years of famine coming after them whereby the plenty of the seven good years would be forgotten.
- But seven years of famine will certainly arise after them, and all the plenty in the land of Egypt will certainly be forgotten and the famine will simply consume the land. (Genesis 41:30)
- And the plenty once in the land will not be known as a result of that famine afterward, because it will certainly be very severe. (Genesis 41:31)
- Joseph counseled Pharaoh to appoint overseers over the land to gather up the crops during the seven years of plenty.
- Let Pharaoh act and appoint overseers over the land, and he must take up one fifth of the land of Egypt during the seven years of plenty. (Genesis 41:34)
- And during the seven years of plenty the land went on producing by the handfuls. (Genesis 41:47)
- And the seven years of the plenty that had obtained in the land of Egypt gradually ended. (Genesis 41:53)
- There came to be plenty donated by the people for the upkeep of the house of Yehowah God in Jerusalem.
- And it came about at the proper time he would bring the chest to the care of the king by the hand of the Levites, and, as soon as they saw that there was plenty of money, the secretary of the king and the commissioner of the chief priest came and then emptied the chest and lifted it up and returned it to its place.

That was the way they did from day to day, so that they gathered money in abundance. (2 Chronicles 24:11)

- When the people took care of their obligations to Yehowah God and to true worship, he blessed them with plenty.
- Then Azariah the chief priest of the house of Zadok said to him, yes, he said; From the time they started to bring the contribution into the house of Yehowah there has been an eating and getting satisfied and having a surplus in abundance, for Yehowah himself has blessed his people, and what has been left over is this great plenty. (2 Chronicles 31:10)
- The King of Persia felt that there would be plenty of contempt and indignation, if he allowed his wife to publicly defy him.
- And this day the princesses of Persia and Media, who have heard the affair of the queen, will talk to all the princes of the king, and there will be plenty of contempt and indignation. (Esther 1:18)
- The rich man is still feeling anxious even when he has plenty.
- While his plenty is at its peak he will be feeling anxious, all the power of misfortune itself will come against him. (Job 20:22)
- The Psalmist prophesies, that there will come to be plenty of grain upon the earth in God's New Order.
- There will come to be plenty of grain on the earth, on the top of the mountains there will be an overflow. His fruit will be as in Lebanon, and those who are from the city will blossom like the vegetation of the earth. (Psalms 72:16)
- When anyone honors Yehowah God with their best firstfruits, then their stores of supply will be filled with plenty.
- Then your stores of supply will be filled with plenty, and with new wine your own press vats will overflow. (Proverbs 3:10)
- The one properly serving Yehowah God his sleep is sweet whether he has much of little, but the plenty belonging to the rich man is not permitting him to sleep.
- Sweet is the sleep of the one serving, regardless of whether it is

little or much that he eats, but the plenty belonging to the rich one is not permitting him to sleep. (Ecclesiastes 5:12)

- Therefore to his beloved brothers, Paul encouraged them to become steadfast and unmovable in their Christian faith, and to keep busy doing the work of the Lord, always having plenty to do during the time of their alien residence here on earth.
- They should realize, that their labors are not in vain, for if they work for Yehowah God and his son Jesus Christ, they will certainly inherit these grand promises, for God is not unrighteous so as to forget their work, and the love they showed for his name.
- Consequently, my beloved brothers, become steadfast, unmovable, always having plenty to do in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in connection with the Lord. (1 Corinthians 15:58)
- God, in turn, will make all those freely giving to the needy, abound in his undeserved kindness, for while they already have full sufficiency in everything, he will make them have plenty for every good work, because they use his gifts properly, and they are generous to the needy ones, like he is.
- God, moreover, is able to make all his undeserved kindness abound toward you, that, while you always have full self-sufficiency in everything, you may have plenty for every good work. (2 Corinthians 9:8)
