~POTIPHERA (26)

(Pot-i'phe-ra) [from Egyptian, meaning, He Whom Ra Has Given]

- Joseph's father-in-law, whose daughter Asenath bore Manasseh and Ephraim.
- After that Pharaoh called Joseph's name Zaphenathpaneah and gave him Asenath the daughter of Potiphera the priest of On as a wife. And Joseph began to go out over the land of Egypt. (Genesis 41:45)
- And before the year of the famine arrived there were born to Joseph two sons, whom Asenath the daughter of Potiphera the priest of On bore to him. (Genesis 41:50)
- And there came to be born to Joseph in the land of Egypt
 Manasseh and Ephraim, whom Asenath the daughter of Potiphera
 the priest of On bore to him. (Genesis 46:20)
- Potiphera was the priest, likely of the sun-god Ra, officiating at On, a center of Egyptian sun worship. In the Cairo Museum there is a stele, a funeral pillar, procured in 1935 B.C.E, that has on it the name Putiphar.
