~PRESENTED (300)

[English, gave, to offer, to place before, awarded, bequested, endowed]

- Because the midwives feared Yehowah God he presented them with families of their own.
- And it came about that because the midwives had feared the true God he later presented them with families. (Exodus 1:21)
- When requested to by Yehowah God the Israelites presented all sorts of gold and silver for the work of the tabernacle.
- And they kept coming, the men along with the women, every willing-hearted one. They brought brooches and earrings and rings and female ornaments, all sorts of articles of gold, that is, everyone who presented the wave offering of gold to Yehowah. (Exodus 35:22)
- The grain offering was to be presented to the priest who then would offer it before Yehowah God at his altar.
- And you must bring the grain offering that was made of these to Yehowah, and it must be presented to the priest and he must bring it near to the altar. (Leviticus 2:8)
- The skin of the burnt offering presented by the priest became his to eat.
- As for the priest who presents the burnt offering of any man, the skin of the burnt offering that he has presented to the priest will become his. (Leviticus 7:8)
- At offering was presented by Aaron's sons on the day they became priests before Yehowah God.
- This was the priestly share of Aaron and the priestly share of his sons from Yehowah's offerings made by fire, on the day that he presented them to act as priests to Yehowah. (Leviticus 7:35)
- Aaron's sons presented the blood at the base of the altar.

- Then Aaron's sons presented the blood to him and he dipped his finger in the blood and put it upon the horns of the altar, and the rest of the blood he poured at the base of the altar. (Leviticus 9:9)
- Then he presented the burnt offering according to the regular procedure.
- Then he presented the burnt offering and handled it according to the regular procedure. (Leviticus 9:16)
- The priest presented the grain offering making part of it smoke upon the altar.
- He next presented the grain offering and filled his hand with some of it and made it smoke upon the altar, apart from the burnt offering of the morning. (Leviticus 9:17)
- They brought their offering before Yehowah God each chieftain in wagons, and presented them before the tabernacle.
- And they brought their offering before Yehowah, six covered wagons and twelve cattle, a wagon for two chieftains and a bull for each one, and they presented them before the tabernacle. (Numbers 7:3)
- Each chieftain presented the same offering as listed below.
- He presented as his offering one silver dish, its weight being a hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels by the shekel of the holy place, both of them full of fine flour moistened with oil for a grain offering. (Numbers 7:19)
- Men who were unclean on the Passover day presented themselves to Moses on that day.
- Now there happened to be men who had become unclean by a human soul so that they were not able to prepare the Passover sacrifice on that day. Hence they presented themselves before Moses and Aaron on that day. (Numbers 9:6)
- The fire holders of Korah and his men became holy because they were presented before Yehowah God, thus they were kept as a sign for Israel for the future, never to try to usurp God-given authority again.

- Even the fire holders of these men who sinned against their own souls. And they must make them into thin metal plates as an overlaying for the altar, because they presented them before Yehowah, so that they became holy, and they should serve as a sign to the sons of Israel. (Numbers 16:38)
- These copper fire holders they presented were then beaten into an overlaying for the altar as a remembrance.
- Accordingly Eleazar the priest took the copper fire holders, which those who had been burned up had presented, and they proceeded to beat them out into an overlaying for the altar. (Numbers 16:39)
- Moses presented the case before Yehowah God.
- At that Moses presented their case before Yehowah. (Numbers 27:5)
- Moses told the Israelites that when men presented themselves before them for judgment, they must judge the righteous one righteous, and judge the wicked one wicked.
- In case a dispute arises between men, and they have presented themselves for the judgment, they must also judge them and pronounce the righteous one righteous and pronounce the wicked one wicked. (Deuteronomy 25:1)
- The daughters of Zelophehad presented themselves before Joshua and Eleazar, asking that they be given the inheritance that Moses assigned to them.
- So they presented themselves before Eleazar the priest and Joshua the son of Nun and the chieftains, saying; Yehowah it was who commanded Moses to give us an inheritance in the midst of our brothers. Accordingly he gave them, at the order of Yehowah, an inheritance in the midst of the brothers of their father. (Joshua 17:4)
- Jael was blessed in song for killing Sisera by making him fall asleep after she presented him with curdled milk to drink.
- Water he asked, milk she gave; In the large banquet bowl of

majestic ones she presented curdled milk. (Judges 5:25)

- When the house of Yehowah God was inaugurated in Jerusalem after the ret from exile they presented hundreds of animals in sacrifice.
- And they presented for the inauguration of this house of God a hundred bulls, two hundred rams, four hundred lambs, and as a sin offering for all Israel twelve male goats, according to the number of the tribes of Israel. (Ezra 6:17)
- Those coming out of the captivity, the former exiles, themselves presented burnt sacrifices to the God of Israel, twelve bulls for all Israel, ninety-six rams, seventy-seven male lambs, twelve hegoats as a sin offering, everything as a burnt offering to Yehowah. (Ezra 8:35)
- Job felt that he had presented a case in justice, for he felt he was entirely in the right.
- Look! Please, I have presented a case of justice. I well know that I myself am in the right. (Job 13:18)
- Jeremiah lamented that the daughter of his people had become cruel like the way an ostrich treats her young.
- Even jackals themselves have presented the udder. They have suckled their cubs. The daughter of my people becomes cruel, like ostriches in the wilderness. (Lamentations 4:3)
- They entered into the house, where they saw Mary its mother and also the young child. They then fell down and did obeisance to it, and presented the young child with treasures and gifts. They gave it frankincense gold and myrrh, valuable treasures in that time.
- And when they went into the house they saw the young child with Mary its mother, and, falling down, they did obeisance to it. They also opened their treasures and presented it with gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. (Matthew 2:11)
- Then the first presented himself and told the king, that he had turned his one mina into ten.
- Then the first one presented himself, saying; Lord, your mina gained ten minas. (Luke 19:16)

- **At daybreak Jesus presented himself at the temple.**
- At daybreak, however, he again presented himself at the temple, and all the people began coming to him, and he sat down and began to teach them. (John 8:2)
- All the widows presented themselves to Peter showing all the garment Dorcas had made for them in her loving-kindness.
- At that Peter rose and went with them. And when he arrived, they led him up into the upper chamber, and all the widows presented themselves to him weeping and exhibiting many inner garments and outer garments that Dorcas used to make while she was with them. (Acts of Apostles 9:39)
- Peter then took her hand and raised her up and presented her allive to her companions.
- Giving her his hand, he raised her up, and he called the holy ones and the widows and presented her alive. (Acts of Apostles 9:41)
- So Paul did as instructed by the elders in Jerusalem, and he took along these four men the next day, cleansing both himself and them ceremonially in the temple, until the offering should be made in their behalf there. This being done in full sight of all the Jews.
- Then Paul took the men along the next day and cleansed himself ceremonially with them and went into the temple, to give notice of the days to be fulfilled for the ceremonial cleansing, until the offering should be presented for each one of them. (Acts of Apostles 21:26)
- So later the horsemen entered into Caesarea, and they then delivered the letter to the governor, placing Paul safely in his charge.
- The horsemen entered into Caesarea and delivered the letter to the governor and also presented Paul to him. (Acts of Apostles 23:33)
- When Christians were within this, Satan the Devil's world, they presented themselves to its desires, because of their fear of death, thus becoming slaves of sin, leading them to lawless conduct before their God. Now Christians must submit to righteousness, with a view

to becoming holy ones before their God. They must not engage in lawless conduct, even though they are not any longer under the Law Covenant and its penalties for wrongdoing.

- I am speaking in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh, for even as you presented your members as slaves to uncleanness and lawlessness with lawlessness in view, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness with holiness in view. (Romans 6:19)
- This Good News of God's Kingdom had presented itself to them there in Colossae, just as it was being presented throughout the known world of Paul's day. Paul has heard, that it is also increasing through them there in Colossae, and it has continued to do so since they first heard of it, because they too take an active share in the preaching of it.
- Which has presented itself to you, even as it is bearing fruit and increasing in all the world just as it is doing also among you, from the day you heard and accurately knew the undeserved kindness of God in truth. (Colossians 1:6)
- The Revelation account was presented to John in signs of symbolisms to show him the things that must shortly take place within the eternal purpose of Yehowah God.
- A revelation by Jesus Christ, which God gave him, to show his slaves the things that must shortly take place. And he sent forth his angel and presented it in signs through him to his slave John. (Revelation 1:1)
