- The people of Egypt felt that Joseph by his wisdom had preserved them alive, and so they readily became slaves to him and to Pharaoh.
- Consequently they said; You have preserved our lives. Let us find favor in the eyes of my lord, and we will become slaves to Pharaoh. (Genesis 47:25)
- The Pharaoh of Egypt called the Hebrew midwives to himself, and asked them why they had preserved the male children alive by going against his previous orders.
- In time the king of Egypt called the midwives and said to them; Why is it you have done this thing, in that you preserved the male children alive? (Exodus 1:18)
- The angel told Balaam that his she-ass had preserved him alive.
- And the she-ass got to see me and tried to turn aside before me these three times. Supposing she had not turned aside from before me! For by now even you I should have killed, but her I should have preserved alive. (Numbers 22:33)
- Moses grew angry at the men of war who preserved alive the females of Midian, because they were the very ones who had enticed Israel to sin.
- So Moses said to them; Have you preserved alive every female? (Numbers 31:15)
- Joshua preserved alive Rahab and all the household because they had hidden the spies.
- And Rahab the prostitute and the household of her father and all who belonged to her, Joshua preserved alive, and she dwells in the midst of Israel down to this day, because she hid the messengers whom Joshua sent out to spy on Jericho. (Joshua 6:25)

- Joshua showed, that Yehowah God had preserved him alive for forty-five years, and that though he was eighty-five years old he still had vigor and strength.
- And now here Yehowah has preserved me alive, just as he promised, these forty-five years since Yehowah made this promise to Moses when Israel walked in the wilderness, and now here I am today eighty-five years old. (Joshua 14:10)
- Gideon told Zebah and Zalmunna, that if they would have preserved his brothers alive he would do the same for them.
- At that he said; They were my brothers, the sons of my mother. As Yehowah lives, if you had preserved them alive, I would not have to kill you. (Judges 8:19)
- The sons of Israel gave to Benjamin the women they had preserved from the inhabitants of Jabesh-gilead as wives.
- Accordingly Benjamin came back at that time. Then they gave them the women that they had preserved alive from the women of Jabesh-gilead, but they did not find enough for them. (Judges 21:14)
- When David struck their land he preserved neither man nor woman alive.
- And David struck the land, but he preserved neither man nor woman alive, and he took flocks and herds and asses and camels and garments, after which he returned and came to Achish. (1 Samuel 27:9)
- The Psalmist showed that his comfort in his affliction were the sayings of his God for they had preserved him alive.
- This is my comfort in my affliction, for your own saying has preserved me alive. (Psalms 119:50)
- To time indefinite I shall not forget your orders, because by them you have preserved me alive. (Psalms 119:93)
- Next he likens the Pharisees and their old traditions to old wineskins, that have already stretched out as much as they can. If someone were to use them to hold new wine, which ferments, giving

off gas as it does, then it would burst the wineskins, and both they and the wine would be lost. So then, people place new wine into new wineskins which have not stretched out completely, and thus both things are preserved.

- Neither do people put new wine into old wineskins, but if they do, then the wineskins burst and the wine spills out and the wineskins are ruined. But people put new wine into new wineskins, and both things are preserved. (Matthew 9:17)
- This wicked Pharaoh used the power of his nation to oppress the Hebrews there in Egypt. He even went so far, as to force the Hebrews to expose their male infants to genocide, that they might not be preserved alive, for this king feared their rapidly growing numbers.
- This one used statecraft against our race and wrongfully forced the fathers to expose their infants, that they might not be preserved alive. (Acts of Apostles 7:19)
- Paul then asks his God to sanctify or cleanse them completely for his service. Paul wants them to be sound in every respect in soul and body and spirit, so that they may be preserved in a blameless manner, at the time of the presence of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- May the very God of peace sanctify you completely. And sound in every respect may the spirit and soul and body of you brothers be preserved in a blameless manner at the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Thessalonians 5:23)
- Jude introduces himself to his readers as a slave of Jesus Christ and addresses his short letter to all of the called ones in union with Jesus Christ in relationship to God the Father, who are preserved for marriage to Jesus Christ.
- Jude, a slave of Jesus Christ, but a brother of James, to the called ones who are loved in relationship with God the Father and preserved for Jesus Christ. (Jude 1:1)
