## ~PROCLAIMED (97)

[English, stated, stated publicly, announced, declared, made known, decreed, asserted, broadcasted, pronounced]

- Naomi's friends and neighbors asked that the name of Boaz be proclaimed in Israel, for his acts of loving-kindness that day.
- And the women began to say to Naomi; Blessed be Yehowah, who has not let a repurchaser fail for you today, that his name may be proclaimed in Israel. (Ruth 4:14)
- Jezebel proclaimed a fast, and then set Naboth up, so as to take his life, and eventually his vineyard, that her husband Ahab desired.
- They proclaimed a fast and had Naboth sit at the head of the people. (1 Kings 21:12)
- Jehu proclaimed a solemn assembly for all Baal priests, so that he could get them all together in one place to destroy them.
- And Jehu went on to say; Sanctify a solemn assembly for Baal. Accordingly they proclaimed it. (2 Kings 10:20)
- When Josiah cleansed the land of Israel of idols and idol priests, he came up a grave of a true prophet who had proclaimed the very work he was doing, and so he did not disturb his resting place.
- When Josiah turned, he got to see the burial places that were there in the mountain. So he sent and took the bones from the burial places and burned them upon the altar, that he might make it unfit for worship, according to Yehowah's word that the man of the true God had proclaimed, who proclaimed these things. (2 Kings 23:16)
- Jehoshaphat proclaimed a fast upon becoming fearful so that all of Judah could set their faces to search for Yehowah God.
- At that Jehoshaphat became afraid and set his face to search for Yehowah. So he proclaimed a fast for all Judah. (2 Chronicles 20:3)

- Ezra proclaimed a fast at the River Ahava upon returning to Israel with the exiles from Babylon, to seek out the right way, Yehowah God's way for them to return.
- Then I proclaimed a fast there at the river Ahava, to humble ourselves before our God, to seek from him the right way for us and for our little ones and for all our goods. (Ezra 8:21)
- In the fifth year of Jehoiakim all the people of Judah and Jerusalem came to Jerusalem and proclaimed a fast before Yehowah God.
- Now it came about in the fifth year of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah, the king of Judah, in the ninth month, that all the people in Jerusalem and all the people that were coming in from the cities of Judah into Jerusalem proclaimed a fast before Yehowah. (Jeremiah 36:9)
- They will then see, that the mighty Pharaoh, who represents Satan the Devil, is a mere noise, something, that passes quickly and it is no more. His long 6,000 year tenure as ruler of the earth is over, and his system must go in its entirety. The time for rejoicing by his people is over, their false religious festivals to their false idol gods must cease.
- There they have proclaimed, Pharaoh the king of Egypt is a mere noise. He has let the festal time pass by. (Jeremiah 46:17)
- Jeremiah knew that there was no future for Jerusalem and that the word that he had proclaimed for her would come upon all of the people within her.
- People have heard how I myself am sighing as a woman. There is no comforter for me. All my enemies themselves have heard of my calamity. They have exulted, because you yourself have done it. You will certainly bring the day that you have proclaimed, that they may become like me. (Lamentations 1:21)
