~PROGRESS (77)

- Ezra reported to the king that fine progress was being made upon the house of Yehowah God in Jerusalem.
- Let it become known to the king that we went to the jurisdictional district of Judah to the house of the great God, and it is being built with stones rolled into place, and timbers are being laid in the walls, and that work is being eagerly done and is making progress in their hands. (Ezra 5:8)
- And the older men of the Jews were building and making progress under the prophesying of Haggai the prophet and Zechariah the grandson of Iddo, and they built and finished it due to the order of the God of Israel and due to the order of Cyrus and Darius and Artaxerxes the king of Persia. (Ezra 6:14)
- Then in the **progress** of these days Jesus went up into a mountain to pray, and there he continued the whole night in prayer alone with his God.
- In the progress of these days he went out into the mountain to pray, and he continued the whole night in prayer to God. (Luke 6:12)
- So those people gripped with fear, asked Jesus to leave their territory, and so Jesus and his disciples left in the boat in which they had come.
- I know that you are Abraham's offspring, but you are seeking to kill me, because my word makes no progress among you. (John 8:37)
- The time of this meeting was 50 days after the Passover, during the festival of Pentecost in Jerusalem. The disciples were gathered together in the upper room and praying as this festival was in progress.
- Now while the day of the festival of Pentecost was in progress they were all together at the same place. (Acts of Apostles 2:1)

- Paul then, as a Jew, was making fine progress in the Law Covenant, being taught at the feet of the learned and well-respected man Gamaliel. He too was far more zealous for the traditions of his forefathers, than were many others of his age and race.
- And I was making greater progress in Judaism than many of my own age in my race, as I was far more zealous for the traditions of my fathers. (Galatians 1:14)
- Paul also realized, that not all in the Christian congregation, have made the same degree of spiritual progress, but still he counsels them all, to go on walking orderly in this same routine.
- At any rate, to what extent we have made progress, let us go on walking orderly in this same routine. (Philippians 3:16)
- Men such as this, will make no further progress in spiritual living, and in the faith, for their madness will become apparent, just as the madness of those two men became.
- Nevertheless, they will make no further progress, for their madness will be very plain to all, even as the madness of those two men became. (2 Timothy 3:9)
